2	WHEREAS, Parents invest an immeasurable amount of time,
3	energy, and devotion to raise their children in order to provide them with
4	the love, support, and guidance required to become responsible,
5	productive, and successful adults; and
6	WHEREAS, The responsibility of raising children is particularly
7	difficult when it falls on the shoulders of a single parent; and
8	WHEREAS, Over a quarter of U.S. families with children under
9	18 years of age are single-parent families, amounting to 10 million
10	households. In 2020, nearly 19 million children were living in
11	single-parent families in the United States; and
12	WHEREAS, In Colorado, over 10 percent of families are led by
13	single parents; and

15	WHEREAS, The greatest need of every child is to be loved, no
16	matter the composition of the child's family; and

WHEREAS, The dedication and achievements of single parents
deserve recognition; and
WHEREAS, In 1984, then-President Ronald Reagan declared
March 21 as "National Single Parent Day"; now, therefore,
Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-third General
Assembly of the State of Colorado:
That we, the members of the Colorado Senate, designate March
21, 2022, as "Single Parent Day in Colorado" in recognition of the
dedication and achievements of all single parents.
