# **Summary of Legislation**

Before conducting a controlled burn, a person must notify their local fire department of the date, time, and location where it will occur. The fire department may determine that its personnel must be on standby at the time of the controlled burn for it to occur.

The bill directs the Department of Public Safety (CDPS) to purchase a mobile driver simulator unit for conducting trainings around the state, transfers money to the Fire Service Education and Training Fund, and makes the transferred money continuously appropriated to the department for operating and staffing the unit.

### **State Transfers**

The bill transfers \$760,000 from the General Fund to the Fire Service Education and Training Fund on the bill's effective date. It transfers an additional \$185,000 each July 1 beginning in 2023.

# **State Expenditures**

The bill increases state expenditures in CDPS by \$741,433 in FY 2022-23 and \$182,547 in FY 2023-24 from the Fire Service Education and Training Fund. Expenditures are shown in Table 2 and detailed below.

**Department of Public Safety.** The department requires a simulator unit, associated equipment, and 1.0 FTE firefighter to conduct trainings. Operating and capital outlay costs include standard equipment, additional training equipment, travel expenses based on an estimated 214 days of travel per year. Other capital expenses include the simulator unit, a tow vehicle, and fuel. Personnel and operating costs, including travel, are prorated in FY 2022-23 to reflect the bill's effective date.

**Centrally appropriated costs.** Pursuant to a Joint Budget Committee policy, certain costs associated with this bill are addressed through the annual budget process and centrally appropriated in the Long Bill or supplemental appropriations bills, rather than in this bill. These costs, which include employee insurance and supplemental employee retirement payments, are shown in Table 2.

### **Local Government**

Expenditures will increase in fire departments to review controlled burn notifications and to be on standby for controlled burns as necessary. This workload may be offset to the extent that advanced notice of controlled burns will allow fire departments to more respond more efficiently to calls from the public reporting known controlled burns as a wildfire.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.

# **State Appropriations**

Money transferred to the Fire Service Education and Training Fund is continuously appropriated to CDPS, and no appropriation is required.
