Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill neither requires nor contains an appropriation clause for FY 2022-23.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

L.001 Bill Sponsor amendment **L.001** (attached) strikes five-year sentencing statutory appropriations affecting FY 2022-23 and future years and removes the effective date currently in the bill. The bill currently strikes all five-year sentencing statutory appropriations and the effective date limits the fiscal impact to FY 2022-23 and future years. L.001 achieves the same fiscal impact as the introduced bill while removing the effective date section.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee (JBC) has proposed a budget package for FY 2022-23 based on the March 2022 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The JBC has included as part of its FY 2022-23 budget package a reduction of \$1,002,490 General Fund appropriations included in this bill.
