Points to Consider*General Fund Impact*

The Joint Budget Committee (JBC) is developing a budget package for FY 2022-23. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$148,889 for FY 2022-23, reducing the General Fund available for other FY 2022-23 appropriations by this amount.
