A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE DEFINITION OF SERIOUS BODILY INJURY IN SECTION
102 18-1-901, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES.

Bill Summary

The bill amends the definition of "serious bodily injury" to include:

- Bodily injury that, either at the time of the actual injury or at a later time, involves a substantial risk specifically associated with the type of injury sustained by the victim or intended by the perpetrator;
- Firearm wounds; or

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-1-901, amend
3	(3)(p) as follows:
4	18-1-901. Definitions. (3) (p) "Serious bodily injury" means
5	bodily injury which THAT, either at the time of the actual injury or at a
6	later time, involves a substantial risk of death; a substantial risk of serious
7	permanent disfigurement; a substantial risk of protracted loss or
8	impairment of the function of any part or organ of the body; or breaks,
9	fractures, <u>A PENETRATING KNIFE OR PENETRATING GUNSHOT WOUND</u> , or
10	burns of the second or third degree.
11	SECTION 2. Effective date. This act takes effect July 1, 2023.
12	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
13	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
14	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
