A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING CONTINUATION OF THE SCHOOL ACCESS FOR**
102 **EMERGENCY RESPONSE GRANT PROGRAM.**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The school access for emergency response (SAFER) grant program is scheduled to repeal on July 1, 2024. The bill extends the SAFER grant program for 5 years, until July 1, 2029, and clarifies when the state treasurer is required to transfer unexpended money from the SAFER grant program's cash fund when the grant program is repealed.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **amend** 24-33.5-2108
3 as follows:

4 **24-33.5-2108. Repeal of part.** This part 21 is repealed, effective
5 July 1, ~~2024.~~ **2029.**

6 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-2107,
7 **amend** (4) as follows:

8 **24-33.5-2107. School access for emergency response grant**
9 **program cash fund.** (4) The state treasurer shall transfer all unexpended
10 and unencumbered money in the fund to the general fund ~~after the grant~~
11 ~~program repeals pursuant to section 24-33.5-2108~~ ON JUNE 30, 2029.

12 **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
13 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
14 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
