A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING MEASURES TO IMPROVE SERVICES FOR STUDENTS WHO

102 USE SUBSTANCES, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN

103 APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Colorado Youth Advisory Council Committee. The bill creates the secondary school student substance use committee (committee) in the department of education (department) to develop a practice, or identify or modify an existing practice, for secondary schools to implement that identifies students who need substance use treatment, offers a brief intervention, and refers the student to substance use treatment resources.

The department is required to publicly publish a report of the committee's findings and submit the report to the superintendent of every school district and chief administrator of every institute charter school that is a secondary school.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:* 2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly 3 finds and declares that: 4 (a) Substance use is a major issue afflicting Colorado youth; 5 (b) Colorado has higher levels of substance use, particularly 6 among youth, than most other states; 7 (c) Colorado schools' substance use intervention programs lack 8 uniformity, resulting in inequitable interventions and treatment referrals 9 for youth; 10 (d) A screening, brief intervention, and referral to treatment 11 methodology has been adopted by schools with school-based health 12 centers, and this methodology has revolutionized substance use treatment 13 for youth; 14 (e) The screening, brief intervention, and referral to treatment 15 methodology, if modified appropriately, may be implemented in 16 secondary schools without school-based health centers in order to provide 17 more support to youth who use substances; 18 (f) Access to the crisis response system is critical for youth 19 suffering from behavioral health and substance use crises; and 20 (g) Adequate funding for the crisis response system is necessary 21 to ensure that youth suffering from behavioral health and substance use 22 crises may seek and receive timely support in order to prevent avoidable 23 outcomes.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 22-2-148 as
 follows:

22-2-148. Secondary school student substance use - committee
- definitions - repeal. (1) (a) THERE IS CREATED IN THE DEPARTMENT THE
SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENT SUBSTANCE USE COMMITTEE, REFERRED TO
IN THIS SECTION AS THE "COMMITTEE". ON OR BEFORE AUGUST 1, 2023,
THE COMMISSIONER SHALL APPOINT THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS TO SERVE
ON THE COMMITTEE:

9 (I) TWO MEMBERS WHO ARE STUDENTS AT A PUBLIC SECONDARY 10 SCHOOL, ONE WHO ATTENDS A SCHOOL THAT IS LOCATED IN A RURAL 11 SCHOOL DISTRICT AND ONE WHO ATTENDS A SCHOOL THAT IS NOT 12 LOCATED IN RURAL SCHOOL DISTRICT;

(II) TWO MEMBERS WHO ARE TEACHERS AT A PUBLIC SECONDARY
school, one who teaches at a school that is located in a rural

(V) TWO MEMBERS WHO ARE PARENTS OR LEGAL GUARDIANS OF
A STUDENT ATTENDING A PUBLIC SECONDARY SCHOOL, ONE WHO IS A
PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN OF A STUDENT ATTENDING A SCHOOL THAT
IS LOCATED IN A RURAL SCHOOL DISTRICT AND ONE WHO IS A PARENT OR
LEGAL GUARDIAN OF A STUDENT ATTENDING A SCHOOL THAT NOT IS
LOCATED IN A RURAL SCHOOL DISTRICT;

8 (VI) TWO MEMBERS WHO ARE LICENSED MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS
9 WITH EXPERTISE IN ADOLESCENT SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS, ONE WHO
10 PRACTICES IN A RURAL REGION AND ONE WHO PRACTICES IN AN URBAN OR
11 SUBURBAN REGION;

(VII) Two MEMBERS WHO ARE SCHOOL NURSES, ONE WHO IS A
SCHOOL NURSE AT A SCHOOL THAT IS LOCATED IN A RURAL SCHOOL
DISTRICT AND ONE WHO IS A SCHOOL NURSE AT A SCHOOL THAT IS NOT
LOCATED IN A RURAL SCHOOL DISTRICT; AND

16 (VIII) Two members who are experts in the practice of
17 SUBSTANCE USE SCREENING, BRIEF INTERVENTION, AND REFERRAL TO
18 TREATMENT, ONE WHO PRACTICES IN A RURAL REGION AND ONE WHO
19 PRACTICES IN AN URBAN OR SUBURBAN REGION.

(b) To the extent practicable, the membership of the
committee must include persons from throughout the state and
Reflect the racial, ethnic, and geographic diversity of the state.
(c) Members of the committee serve at the pleasure of the
commissioner, and serve without compensation or per diem.
(2) The committee shall develop a practice, or identify or

COLORADO THAT THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES IS RURAL, BASED ON THE
GEOGRAPHIC SIZE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE DISTANCE OF THE
SCHOOL DISTRICT FROM THE NEAREST LARGE, URBANIZED AREA.

23 (c) "SECONDARY SCHOOL" MEANS A MIDDLE SCHOOL, JUNIOR HIGH
 24 SCHOOL, OR HIGH SCHOOL.

25 (d) "SUBSTANCE USE" MEANS THE USE OF ALCOHOL, TOBACCO,
26 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES, OR PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION.

27 (5) This section is repealed, effective July 1, 2025.

1 SECTION 3. Appropriation. For the 2023-24 state fiscal year, 2 \$49,950 is appropriated to the department of education. This 3 appropriation is from the general fund and is based on an assumption that 4 the department will require an additional 0.2 FTE. To implement this act, 5 the department may use this appropriation for a secondary school student 6 substance use committee.

SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
