### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING REQUIREMENTS FOR AFFIDAVITS OF SUPPORT RELATED 102 TO ELIGIBILITY FOR PUBLIC BENEFITS IN COLORADO.

## **Bill Summary**

The bill eliminates the requirement for a person who is lawfully residing in the state, a legal immigrant who is a resident of the state, or an undocumented individual to refrain from executing an affidavit of support for the purpose of sponsoring an undocumented individual while the person is receiving public services or medical assistance.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **repeal** 25.5-3-105 as 3 follows: 4 25.5-3-105. Eligibility of legal immigrants for services. A legal 5 immigrant who is a resident of the state of Colorado shall be eligible to 6 receive services under this part 1 so long as he or she meets the eligibility 7 requirements. As used in this section, "legal immigrant" has the same 8 meaning as described in section 25.5-4-103 (10). As a condition of 9 eligibility for services under this part 1, a legal immigrant shall agree to 10 refrain from executing an affidavit of support for the purpose of 11 sponsoring an alien on or after July 1, 1997, under rules promulgated by 12 the immigration and naturalization service, or any successor agency, 13 during the pendency of such legal immigrant's receipt of services under 14 this part 1. Nothing in this section shall be construed to affect a legal 15 immigrant's eligibility for services under this part 1 based upon such legal 16 immigrant's responsibilities under an affidavit of support entered into 17 before July 1, 1997. 18 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25.5-5-101, repeal 19 (3) as follows: 20 25.5-5-101. Mandatory provisions - eligible groups - rules. 21 (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of this article and articles 4 and 22 6 of this title 25.5, as a condition of eligibility for medical assistance 23 under this article 5 and articles 4 and 6 of this title 25.5, a person who is 24 lawfully residing in the state shall agree to refrain from executing an 25 affidavit of support for the purpose of sponsoring an alien on or after July 26 1, 1997, under rules promulgated by the immigration and naturalization

1	service, or any successor agency, during the pendency of the fawfully
2	residing person's receipt of medical assistance. Nothing in this subsection
3	(3) affects a lawfully residing person's eligibility for medical assistance
4	pursuant to this article 5 and articles 4 and 6 of this title 25.5 based upon
5	the lawfully residing person's responsibilities under an affidavit of
6	support entered into before July 1, 1997.
7	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 26-2-111.8, repeal
8	(5) as follows:
9	26-2-111.8. Eligibility of noncitizens for public assistance.
10	(5) As a condition of eligibility for public assistance under this article, a
11	qualified alien shall agree to refrain from executing an affidavit of
12	support for the purpose of sponsoring an alien on or after July 1, 1997,
13	under rules promulgated by the immigration and naturalization service or
14	its successor agency during the pendency of the qualified alien's receipt
15	of public assistance. Nothing in this subsection (5) shall be construed to
16	affect a qualified alien's eligibility for public assistance under this article
17	based upon the qualified alien's responsibilities under an affidavit of
18	support entered into before July 1, 1997.
19	SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
20	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
21	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
22	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
23	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
24	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
25	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
26	November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
27	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
