1           **SECTION 2. Appropriation to the office of the governor for**  
2 **the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020.** In Session Laws of Colorado  
3 2021, **amend** section 15 (1) of chapter 371, (HB 21-1289), as section 15  
4 (1) is amended by section 2 of chapter 493 (HB 22-1172), Session Laws  
5 of Colorado 2022, as follows:

6           Section 15. **Appropriations.** (1) For the 2020-21 state fiscal year,  
7 ~~\$35,000,000~~ \$27,000,000 is appropriated to the office of the governor for  
8 use by the office of information technology for use by the Colorado  
9 broadband office. This appropriation is from the digital inclusion grant  
10 program fund created in section 24-37.5-904 (2), C.R.S., and of money  
11 the state received from the federal coronavirus state fiscal recovery fund.  
12 The Colorado broadband office may use this appropriation to implement
