SECTION 2. Appropriation to the office of the governor for
 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020. In Session Laws of Colorado
 2021, amend section 15 (1) of chapter 371, (HB 21-1289), as section 15
 (1) is amended by section 2 of chapter 493 (HB 22-1172), Session Laws
 of Colorado 2022, as follows:

6 Section 15. Appropriations. (1) For the 2020-21 state fiscal year, 7 \$35,000,000 \$27,000,000 is appropriated to the office of the governor for 8 use by the office of information technology for use by the Colorado 9 broadband office. This appropriation is from the digital inclusion grant 10 program fund created in section 24-37.5-904 (2), C.R.S., and of money 11 the state received from the federal coronavirus state fiscal recovery fund. 12 The Colorado broadband office may use this appropriation to implement 13 the digital inclusion grant program created in section 24-37.5-904(1)(a), 14 C.R.S. Any money appropriated in this subsection (1) not expended prior 15 to July 1, 2022, is further appropriated to the office of the governor for 16 use by the office of information technology for the 2022-23 state fiscal 17 year for the same purpose.

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
