Department of Human Services, Behavioral Health Administration, Community-based Mental Health Services, Assertive Community Treatment Programs and Other Alternatives to the Mental Health Institutes -- It is the General Assembly's intent that \$545,631 of this General Fund appropriation be allocated to a community mental health center in western Colorado for the purpose of providing behavioral health services for individuals who seek care from the emergency department of a regional medical center and who are diagnosed with physical health conditions that may be exacerbated by co-occurring mental
