A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING STIPENDS FOR NATIONAL BOARD-CERTIFIED EDUCATORS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

Current law requires the department of education (department) to award an annual stipend of \$1,600 to teachers, school counselors, principals, and school psychologists who hold national board certification and who are employed by a school district, board of cooperative services, charter school of a school district, or an institute charter school (local education provider). The bill extends the \$1,600 stipend to qualified librarians and school social workers who hold national board certification and who are employed by a local education provider.

Current law allows the department to award an additional \$3,200 annual stipend to teachers, principals, school counselors, and school psychologists who are employed in a low-performing, high-needs school. The bill allows the department to also extend an additional \$3,200 stipend to librarians or school social workers who are employed in a low-performing, high-needs school. The additional \$3,200 stipend is also extended to teachers, librarians, school counselors, school psychologists, or school social workers (national board-certified educators) who are employed in a rural school district. The bill allows the department to extend an additional \$3,200 stipend to national board-certified educators who are employed as math teachers in any school.

If a national board-certified educator transfers employment from one low-performing, high-needs school or rural school district to another low-performing, high-needs school or rural school district, the educator remains eligible for the additional stipend. However, if a national board-certified educator leaves employment with a low-performing, high-needs school or rural school district, the educator is no longer eligible for the additional stipend.

If a national board-certified math teacher transfers schools as a math teacher, the educator remains eligible for the additional stipend. However, if a national board-certified educator who is a math teacher stops teaching math, the educator is no longer eligible for the additional stipend.

If there are insufficient funds, the department shall reduce the amount of each stipend by the same percentage that the deficit bears to the amount required to fully fund the total number of national board-certified educators who qualify for the stipend.

A national board-certified educator who is employed as a principal or an administrator in a school and maintains a national certification is eligible for a stipend.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

awarded, the department shall allocate the stipend money to the school
district that employs the school professional NATIONAL BOARD-CERTIFIED
EDUCATOR who is to receive the stipend, and the school district shall then
make payment directly to the eligible school professional NATIONAL
BOARD-CERTIFIED EDUCATOR. A school district may, at its discretion,
withhold any required employer retirement and medicare contributions
associated with the stipend pursuant to this section from the one thousand
six hundred dollar stipend amount. For any stipends that are awarded, the

- (b) Payable on May 1, 2020, and each May 1 thereafter, for nationally certified school psychologists;
- (e) In addition to, and not in lieu of, any existing compensation being awarded at the local level to a school professional NATIONAL BOARD-CERTIFIED EDUCATOR.
- (2) (a) Beginning with the 2009-10 school year for nationally certified teachers, school counselors, and principals, and beginning with the 2019-20 school year for nationally certified school psychologists, subject to available appropriations ON OR BEFORE MAY 1, 2024, AND EACH MAY 1 THEREAFTER, an additional annual stipend of three thousand two hundred dollars shall be IS awarded to any school professional NATIONAL BOARD-CERTIFIED EDUCATOR who meets the criteria set forth in subsection (1) of this section and who is employed as of May 1 in a given school year in a low-performing, high-needs school Subject to available appropriations, a school professional shall continue to receive the additional stipend award pursuant to this subsection (2) if the school professional remains employed in a school that was previously a low-performing, high-needs school but improved sufficiently to implement an improvement or performance plan pursuant to section 22-11-210 OR RURAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, OR EMPLOYED AS A MATH TEACHER IN A SCHOOL. IF THE NATIONAL BOARD-CERTIFIED EDUCATOR QUALIFIES FOR THE STIPEND IN THIS SUBSECTION (2) BASED ON MORE THAN ONE QUALIFICATION, THE EDUCATOR RECEIVES ONLY ONE ANNUAL STIPEND OF THREE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS. The additional stipend for a school professional NATIONAL BOARD-CERTIFIED EDUCATOR

is subject to the same restrictions and requirements as set forth in subsection (1) of this section.

- (b) If a national board-certified educator transfers employment from one low-performing, high-needs school or rural school district to another low-performing, high-needs school or rural school district, the educator remains eligible for the additional stipend pursuant to subsection (2)(a) of this section. If a national board-certified educator leaves employment with a low-performing, high-needs school or rural school district, the educator is no longer eligible for the additional stipend pursuant to subsection (2)(a) of this section.
- (c) If a national board-certified educator who teaches math transfers from one school to another and continues to teach math, the educator remains eligible for the additional stipend pursuant to subsection (2)(a) of this section. If a national board-certified educator stops teaching math in a school, the educator is no longer eligible for the additional stipend pursuant to subsection (2)(a) of this section.
- (4) If insufficient funding is available to award a stipend pursuant to subsection (1) of this section to all school professionals stipends shall be awarded only to those school professionals who meet the criteria of subsection (1) of this section and who are employed in a low-performing, high-needs school If there are insufficient funds to award stipends, the department shall reduce the amount of each stipend awarded by the same percentage that the deficit bears to the amount required to fully fund the total number of national board-certified educators who qualify for the stipend.
