Bill Summary

Statutory Revision Committee. Current law states that the attorney general has concurrent jurisdiction with the relevant district

attorney over part 3 of article 120 of title 12, Colorado Revised Statutes. Part 3 refers to the regulation of land surveyors. The bill makes a correction to the statute by changing "part 3" to "part 4" to refer to the regulation of architects.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-31-101, amend 3 (1)(e) as follows: 4 **24-31-101.** Powers and duties of attorney general. (1) The 5 attorney general: 6 (e) Shall have concurrent jurisdiction with the relevant district 7 attorney over part 3 PART 4 of article 120 of title 12; 8 **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 9 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 10 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except 11 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V 12 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this 13 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take 14 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 15 November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 16 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
