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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING THE CONTINUATION OF THE COLORADO FOOD SYSTEMS
102	ADVISORY COUNCIL, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH,
103	EXTENDING THE SUNSET DATE BY THREE YEARS AND MAKING AN
104	APPROPRIATION.

### **Bill Summary**

**Sunset Process - Senate Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee.** The Colorado food systems advisory council established within Colorado state university is scheduled to repeal on September 1,





2023. The bill extends the sunset date until September 1, 2030.

11	advisory committees will repeal on September 1, 2026:

14	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-31-1102, amend
15	(2)(b) introductory portion; and add (2)(b)(XII) and (2.1) as follows:
16	23-31-1102. Colorado food systems advisory council - created
17	- membership - terms - vacancies. (2) The council consists of:
18	(b) Sixteen SEVENTEEN members appointed ON A ROTATING BASIS
19	IN THE ORDER LISTED IN THIS SUBSECTION (2)(b), AS NEW POSITIONS OR
20	VACANCIES ARISE, by the governor or the governor's designee THE
21	SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE MINORITY LEADER OF
22	THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE, AND
23	THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE SENATE, as follows:

6	<b><u>23-31-1103.</u></b> Council - purpose and duties. (1) The purposes
7	PURPOSE of the council include IS TO GROW LOCAL, REGIONAL, AND
8	STATEWIDE FOOD ECONOMIES WITHIN WHICH PRODUCERS HAVE ACCESS TO
9	NEW MARKETS AND LOW-INCOME POPULATIONS HAVE ACCESS TO FRESH,
10	AFFORDABLE, AND HEALTHY FOODS. DUTIES OF THE COUNCIL INCLUDE:
11	(a) Growing local, regional, and statewide food economies within
12	which producers have access to new markets and low-income populations
13	have access to fresh, affordable, and healthy foods. The council will
14	collaborate and coordinate COLLABORATING AND COORDINATING with
15	agricultural producers, relevant state and federal educational institutions,
16	nongovernmental organizations, and consumers to connect state and
17	federal agencies and to provide Colorado agricultural producers,
18	including fruit and vegetable producers, with viable market opportunities.
19	Areas of focus include:
20	(III) Supporting the implementation of the recommendations in
21	the Colorado blueprint of food and agriculture project, ensuring that the
22	recommendations in the blueprint, or its successor project, are updated as
23	needed, and ensuring alignment with other state or local food plans if
24	relevant. EXAMINING BEST PRACTICES TO ADVANCE OR IMPROVE
25	DISTRIBUTION SYSTEMS AND DEVELOP NEW MARKETS FOR COLORADO
26	AGRICULTURAL PRODUCERS.
27	(b) Conducting research regarding national best practices

1	regarding food and nutrition assistance, direct and intermediated market
2	development, institutional procurement, and farm-to-school programs; as
3	well as other priorities determined by the council;
4	(b.5) SERVING AS A RESOURCE FOR RESEARCH AND SUPPORT AT
5	THE REQUEST OF THE GOVERNOR, MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,
6	OR ANY STATE AGENCY IN CONNECTION WITH THE COUNCIL'S PURPOSE AND
7	DUTIES IN SUBSECTIONS (1)(a) AND (1)(b) OF THIS SECTION;
8	(3) THE COUNCIL SHALL ACCEPT AND CONSIDER PUBLIC COMMENT
9	REGARDING ANY RESEARCH OR REPORTS CREATED BY THE COUNCIL
10	PURSUANT TO SUBSECTIONS (1)(b) AND (1)(b.5) OF THIS SECTION. THE
11	COUNCIL SHALL RECEIVE PUBLIC COMMENT FOR A MINIMUM OF SIXTY
12	DAYS.
13	SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-31-1104, repeal
14	(2) as follows:
15	<b><u>23-31-1104.</u></b> Subcommittees of the council. (2) The council may
16	engage in any other activity the council determines is necessary to
17	accomplish the purposes outlined in this part 11.
18	SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 23-31-1106
19	<u>as follows:</u>
20	23-31-1106. Reports - recommendations. Notwithstanding
21	section 24-1-136 (11)(a)(I), no later than January 31, 2021, and January
22	31 every other year thereafter, the council shall report the information
23	specified in section 23-31-1103 (1)(d) AND PROVIDE A SUMMARY OF THE
24	COUNCIL'S ACTIVITIES FROM THE PRIOR YEAR AND A SUMMARY OF THE
25	COUNCIL'S PLANNED ACTIVITIES FOR THE UPCOMING YEAR to the house
26	rural affairs and agriculture AGRICULTURE, WATER, AND NATURAL
27	RESOURCES committee and the senate agriculture and natural resources

2	SECTION 6. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 23-31-1107
3	as follows:
4	23-31-1107. Repeal of part. This part 11 is repealed, effective
5	September 1, 2023 SEPTEMBER 1, 2026. Before the repeal, this part 11 is
6	scheduled for review in accordance with section 2-3-1203.
7	SECTION 7. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-3.3-103, add (12)
8	<u>as follows:</u>
9	<b>23-3.3-103.</b> Annual appropriations - repeal. (12) (a) THE
10	PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION CONCERNING
11	APPROPRIATIONS FOR STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER THIS
12	ARTICLE 3.3 DO NOT APPLY TO APPROPRIATIONS MADE FOR THE PURPOSE
13	OF THE COLORADO FOOD SYSTEMS ADVISORY COUNCIL PURSUANT TO PART
14	<u>11 of article 31 of this title 23.</u>
15	(b) This subsection (12) is repealed, effective September 1,
16	<u>2026.</u>
17	SECTION 8. Appropriation. (1) For the 2023-24 state fiscal
18	year, \$151,068 is appropriated to the department of higher education. This
19	appropriation is from the general fund. To implement this act, the
20	department may use this appropriation for the college opportunity fund
21	program to be used for limited purpose fee-for-service contracts with
22	state institutions.
23	(2) For the 2023-24 state fiscal year, \$151,068 is appropriated to
24	the department of higher education. This appropriation is from
25	reappropriated funds received from the limited purpose fee-for-service
26	contracts with state institutions under subsection (1) of this section. To
27	implement this act, the department may use this appropriation for the

1	board of governors of the Colorado state university system for the food
2	systems advisory council, which amount is based on an assumption that
3	the board of governors will require an additional 1.0 FTE

4	SECTION <u>9.</u> Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
5	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
6	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
7	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
8	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
9	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
10	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
11	November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
12	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
