A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING THE CONTINUATION OF THE COLORADO FOOD SYSTEMS ADVISORY COUNCIL, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, EXTENDING THE SUNSET DATE BY THREE YEARS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Sunset Process - Senate Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee. The Colorado food systems advisory council established within Colorado state university is scheduled to repeal on September 1, 2023. The bill extends the sunset date until September 1, 2030.

21	recommendations in the blueprint, or its successor project, are updated as
22	needed, and ensuring alignment with other state or local food plans if
23	relevant. Examining best practices to advance or improve
24	DISTRIBUTION SYSTEMS AND DEVELOP NEW MARKETS FOR COLORADO
25	AGRICULTURAL PRODUCERS.
26	(b) Conducting research regarding national best practices
27	regarding food and nutrition assistance, direct and intermediated market

2	well as other priorities determined by the council;
3	(b.5) SERVING AS A RESOURCE FOR RESEARCH AND SUPPORT AT
4	THE REQUEST OF THE GOVERNOR, MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,
5	OR ANY STATE AGENCY IN CONNECTION WITH THE COUNCIL'S PURPOSE AND
6	DUTIES IN SUBSECTIONS (1)(a) AND (1)(b) OF THIS SECTION;
7	(3) THE COUNCIL SHALL ACCEPT AND CONSIDER PUBLIC COMMENT
8	REGARDING ANY RESEARCH OR REPORTS CREATED BY THE COUNCIL

1	SECTION <u>6.</u> In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 23-31-1107
2	as follows:
3	23-31-1107. Repeal of part. This part 11 is repealed, effective
4	September 1, 2023 SEPTEMBER 1, 2026. Before the repeal, this part 11 is
5	scheduled for review in accordance with section 2-3-1203.
6	SECTION 7. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
7	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
8	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
9	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
10	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
11	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
12	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
13	November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
14	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
