A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING CREATING A BONUS PAYMENT PROGRAM TO INCENTIVIZE
102 COLORADO PRESCHOOL PROVIDERS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE
103 COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM.

Bill Summary

The bill creates the Colorado preschool program provider participation bonus program (bonus program). The bonus program provides a one-time bonus payment to any eligible preschool provider (provider) that participates in the preschool program established in the department of early childhood (department). The bonus program can also

award additional bonus payments if the eligible recipient maintains or increases the eligible recipient's licensed capacity to serve infants and toddlers between April 1, 2022, and April 1, 2024.

The purpose of the bonus program is to:

- Increase provider participation in the Colorado universal preschool program (preschool program) to ensure that all children have access to a universal preschool classroom in their communities;
- Strengthen the mixed delivery system by supporting providers that have not previously participated in the Colorado state-run preschool program; and
- Preserve access to infant and toddler care.

Providers are required to use the bonus payments to implement or support the preschool program or maintain or expand infant and toddler care.

The department is required to report to the joint budget committee on or before September 1, 2024, on the number and types of providers that receive bonus payments and the number and types of bonus payments awarded.

The bonus program is repealed, effective July 1, 2025.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 26.5-4-211 as follows:

26.5-4-211. Colorado universal preschool program provider participation bonus program - report - rules - definitions - repeal.

(1) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES:

(a) "COLORADO STATE-RUN PRESCHOOL PROGRAM" MEANS THE COLORADO PRESCHOOL PROGRAM ADMINISTERED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 28 OF TITLE 22 AS IT EXISTED PRIOR TO JULY 1, 2023.

(b) "COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM APPLICATION PORTAL" MEANS THE SYSTEM THE DEPARTMENT ADMINISTERS TO OPERATE AND TRACK THE PUBLIC'S PARTICIPATION IN THE COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM ADMINISTERED PURSUANT TO PART 2 OF ARTICLE 4

1 OF THIS TITLE 26.5.

2 (c) "COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM PROVIDER
3 PARTICIPATION BONUS PROGRAM" OR "BONUS PROGRAM" MEANS THE
4 COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM PROVIDER PARTICIPATION
5 BONUS PROGRAM CREATED IN SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION.

6 (d) "ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT" MEANS A PRESCHOOL PROVIDER
7 PARTICIPATING IN THE COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM
8 CREATED PURSUANT TO SECTION 26.5-4-204 THAT HAS SIGNED A
9 PROVIDER AGREEMENT AND IS IN GOOD STANDING WITH THE DEPARTMENT.

10 (e) "LOW-CAPACITY PRESCHOOL AREA" MEANS A COMMUNITY
11 WITH INSUFFICIENT COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAMMING
12 CAPACITY TO MEET THE DEMAND OF PARENTS IN THE PRESCHOOL AREA
13 WHO WISH TO ENROLL THE PARENTS' CHILDREN.

14 (2) THERE IS CREATED IN THE DEPARTMENT THE COLORADO
15 UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM PROVIDER PARTICIPATION BONUS
16 PROGRAM. THE PURPOSE OF THE BONUS PROGRAM IS TO:

17 (a) INCREASE PRESCHOOL PROVIDER PARTICIPATION IN THE
18 COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM TO ENSURE THAT ALL
19 CHILDREN HAVE ACCESS TO A UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL CLASSROOM IN
20 THEIR COMMUNITIES;

21 (b) STRENGTHEN THE MIXED DELIVERY SYSTEM BY SUPPORTING
22 PRESCHOOL PROVIDERS THAT HAVE NOT PREVIOUSLY PARTICIPATED IN THE
23 COLORADO STATE-RUN PRESCHOOL PROGRAM; AND

24 (c) PRESERVE ACCESS TO INFANT AND TODDLER CARE.

25 (3) (a) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH AND MAKE PUBLICLY
26 AVAILABLE A PROCESS FOR SOLICITING, VETTING, AWARDING, AND
27 MONITORING PAYMENTS UNDER THE BONUS PROGRAM THAT ALIGNS WITH

1 THE PURPOSES OF THE COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM. THE
2 DEPARTMENT SHALL POST THE PROCESS ON THE DEPARTMENT'S WEBSITE.

3 (b) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MAY PROMULGATE RULES, AS
4 NECESSARY, FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAM.

5 (c) (I) AN ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT MUST RECEIVE A BONUS PAYMENT
6 IF THE ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT HAS REGISTERED WITH THE COLORADO
7 UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM APPLICATION PORTAL TO PARTICIPATE
8 IN THE COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM BY AUGUST 31,
9 2023, AND HAS NOT PREVIOUSLY PARTICIPATED IN THE COLORADO
10 STATE-RUN PRESCHOOL PROGRAM.

11 (II) AN ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT MAY RECEIVE ADDITIONAL BONUS
12 PAYMENTS IF THE ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT:

13 (A) IS LICENSED TO PROVIDE CARE TO INFANTS AND TODDLERS
14 AND IS IN GOOD STANDING WITH THE DEPARTMENT; AND

15 (B) MAINTAINS OR INCREASES THE ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT'S LICENSED
16 CAPACITY TO SERVE INFANTS AND TODDLERS BETWEEN APRIL 1, 2022,
17 AND APRIL 1, 2024.

18 (III) SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE APPROPRIATIONS, THE DEPARTMENT
19 SHALL FURTHER DISTRIBUTE BONUS PAYMENTS TO AN ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT
20 LOCATED IN A LOW-CAPACITY PRESCHOOL AREA THAT REGISTERS WITH
21 THE COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM APPLICATION PORTAL
22 TO PARTICIPATE IN THE COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM.

23 (4) AN ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT AWARDED A BONUS PAYMENT
24 PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION SHALL USE THE BONUS PAYMENT TO
25 IMPLEMENT OR SUPPORT THE COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL
26 PROGRAM OR MAINTAIN OR EXPAND INFANT AND TODDLER CARE IN THIS
27 STATE.

1 (5) (a) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2023, THE DEPARTMENT
2 SHALL CALCULATE THE NUMBER OF ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS THAT APPLIED
3 FOR A BONUS PAYMENT PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (3)(c) OF THIS SECTION
4 AND, BASED ON AVAILABLE APPROPRIATIONS, DETERMINE AN AMOUNT FOR
5 THE BONUS PAYMENT.

6 (b) ALL BONUS PAYMENTS MUST BE DISTRIBUTED TO ELIGIBLE
7 RECIPIENTS THAT QUALIFY PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (3)(c) OF THIS
8 SECTION FOR A BONUS PAYMENT ON OR BEFORE JUNE 30, 2024.

9 (6) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2024, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL
10 SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE JOINT BUDGET COMMITTEE SUMMARIZING THE
11 FOLLOWING:

12 (a) THE NUMBER OF ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS THAT RECEIVED A BONUS
13 PAYMENT;

14 (b) THE TYPES OF ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS THAT RECEIVED A BONUS
15 PAYMENT PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (3)(c) OF THIS SECTION;

16 (c) THE AMOUNT OF EACH BONUS PAYMENT; AND

17 (d) THE NUMBER OF BONUS PAYMENTS AWARDED PURSUANT TO
18 SUBSECTIONS (3)(c)(I), (3)(c)(II), AND (3)(c)(III) OF THIS SECTION,
19 RESPECTIVELY.

20 (7) THIS SECTION IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2025.

21 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
22 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
23 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
