A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE CREATION OF THE COLORADO RIVER DROUGHT 102 TASK FORCE.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill creates the Colorado river drought task force (task force). The members of the task force must, to the extent practicable, reflect the racial and ethnic diversity of the state and have experience with a wide range of water issues. The task force must begin meeting no later than July 31, 2023, and may hold up to 12 meetings in the 2023 legislative interim.

The purpose of the task force is to develop recommendations for state legislation that provides additional tools for the Colorado water conservation board to collaborate with the Colorado river water conservation district, the southwestern water conservation district, and other relevant stakeholders in the development of programs that address drought in the Colorado river basin and interstate commitments related to the Colorado river and its tributaries through conservation of the waters of the Colorado river and its tributaries (recommendations).

No later than December 15, 2023, the task force must submit a written report that includes the recommendations and a summary of the task force's work to the water resources and agriculture review committee.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

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2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly finds and declares that:

- (a) Since 2000, the Colorado river basin, including the Colorado river and its tributaries in Colorado, has experienced unprecedented drought conditions that have contributed to decreased water supplies;
- (b) Climate change, drier conditions, and depleted snowpack may further reduce water available in Colorado's surface streams for beneficial uses and threaten Colorado's significant interests in the Colorado river and its tributaries; and
- (c) Dry hydrology continues to reduce water supplies across the western slope of Colorado and the Colorado river basin and threatens the security of available water resources.
- (2) The general assembly therefore determines that it is in the best interest of Colorado to form a task force to provide recommendations for programs to assist Colorado in addressing drought in the Colorado river basin and the state's interstate commitments related to the Colorado river and its tributaries.
- **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 37-98-105 as

22	CONSUMPTIVE USES OF WATER FOR MUNICIPAL, INDUSTRIAL, AND
23	IRRIGATION PURPOSES AND NONCONSUMPTIVE USES OF WATER FOR
24	OUTDOOR RECREATION, FISH AND WILDLIFE, AND HYDROPOWER PURPOSES.
25	(3) (a) No later than June 30, 2023:
26	(I) THE APPOINTING AUTHORITIES SHALL MAKE ALL APPOINTMENTS
27	TO THE TASK FORCE; AND

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1	(II) THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES SHALL
2	APPOINT A CHAIR OF THE TASK FORCE.
3	(b) No later than July 15,2023, the executive committee of
4	THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CREATED IN SECTION 2-3-301 (1) SHALL HIRE
5	A FACILITATOR TO SUPPORT THE WORK OF THE TASK FORCE.
6	(c) No later than July $31,2023$, the chair of the task force

8	CONVENE THE FIRST MEETING OF THE TASK FORCE. THE TASK FORCE MAY

13	COMPENSATION BUT MAY BE REIMBURSED FOR ANY REASONABLE

16	(II) AN APPOINTING AUTHORITY MAY REMOVE A MEMBER OF THE
17	TASK FORCE FROM THE TASK FORCE FOR MALFEASANCE IN OFFICE, FAILURE
18	TO REGULARLY ATTEND MEETINGS, OR ANY CAUSE THAT MAKES THE
19	MEMBER UNABLE OR UNFIT TO FULFILL THE MEMBER'S DUTIES PURSUANT
20	TO THIS SECTION.
21	(III) A MEMBER OF THE TASK FORCE MAY DESIGNATE ANOTHER
22	PERSON THAT MEETS THE MEMBER'S QUALIFICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP ON
23	THE TASK FORCE TO ATTEND A MEETING OR MEETINGS OF THE TASK FORCE
24	ON THE MEMBER'S BEHALF IF THE MEMBER IS UNABLE TO ATTEND A
25	MEETING OR MEETINGS.
26	(4) (a) The purpose of the task force is to provide
27	RECOMMENDATIONS FOR STATE LEGISLATION THAT WILL PROVIDE

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1	ADDITIONAL TOOLS TO THE BOARD TO COLLABORATE WITH THE
2	COLORADO RIVER WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT, THE SOUTHWESTERN
3	WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT, AND OTHER RELEVANT STAKEHOLDERS,
4	INCLUDING HOLDERS OF WATER RIGHTS, AGRICULTURAL PRODUCERS,
5	INDUSTRIAL WATER USERS, ENVIRONMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS, THE UTE
6	MOUNTAIN UTE TRIBE, THE SOUTHERN UTE INDIAN TRIBE, AND LOCAL
7	GOVERNMENTS, TO DEVELOP PROGRAMS THAT ADDRESS DROUGHT IN THE
8	COLORADO RIVER BASIN AND INTERSTATE COMMITMENTS RELATED TO THE
9	COLORADO RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES THROUGH THE IMPLEMENTATION
10	OF DEMAND REDUCTION PROJECTS AND THE VOLUNTARY AND
11	COMPENSATED CONSERVATION OF THE WATERS OF THE COLORADO RIVER
12	AND ITS TRIBUTARIES.
13	(b) The recommendations made pursuant to subsection
14	(4)(a) OF THIS SECTION MUST, AT A MINIMUM:
15	(I) PROVIDE THAT THE PROGRAMS MUST BE ADOPTED AND
16	IMPLEMENTED IN A MANNER THAT AVOIDS DISPROPORTIONATE NEGATIVE
17	ECONOMIC OR ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS TO ANY SINGLE SUBBASIN OR
18	REGION IN THE STATE;
19	(II) PROVIDE THAT ANY PROGRAM THAT SEEKS TO ADMINISTER
20	WATER THROUGH STREAM REACHES WITHIN THE STATE OR TO THE STATE
21	LINE FOR INTERSTATE PURPOSES MUST BE OPERATED IN A MANNER THAT
22	PROTECTS EXISTING USES AND SOME REASONABLE INCREMENT OF FUTURE
23	DEVELOPMENT IN THE COLORADO RIVER BASIN WITHOUT ALLOWING OR
24	PROTECTING A NEW TRANSMOUNTAIN DIVERSION;
25	(III) REQUIRE THAT ANY ACQUISITION BY THE PROGRAMS OF A
26	WATER RIGHT USED FOR AGRICULTURAL IRRIGATION PURPOSES IS
27	VOLUNTARY, TEMPORARY, AND COMPENSATED;

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1	(IV) SPECIFY THE RESPECTIVE ROLES AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE
2	BOARD, THE COLORADO RIVER WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT, AND THE
3	SOUTHWESTERN WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT IN THE DEVELOPMENT,
4	IMPLEMENTATION, AND OPERATION OF THE PROGRAMS WHILE

19	FORCE.
20	(6) (a) Before the submission of the final report pursuant
21	TO SUBSECTION $(6)(b)$ of this section, the task force shall provide
22	AT LEAST ONE UPDATE TO THE COMMITTEE ON THE PROGRESS OF THE TASK
23	FORCE'S DUTIES PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION.
24	(b) No later than December 15, 2023, the task force shall
25	SUBMIT A FINAL REPORT TO THE COMMITTEE THAT PROVIDES:
26	(I) THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE TASK FORCE PURSUANT TO
27	SUBSECTION (4)(a) OF THIS SECTION;

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1	(II) A SUMMARY OF THE TASK FORCE'S WORK PURSUANT TO THIS
2	SECTION, INCLUDING ANY RECOMMENDATIONS CONSIDERED BUT NOT
3	APPROVED BY THE TASK FORCE AND A DESCRIPTION OF WHY THE
4	RECOMMENDATIONS WERE NOT APPROVED; AND
5	(III) ANY OTHER INFORMATION THAT THE TASK FORCE
6	DETERMINES TO BE RELEVANT.
7	(7) This section is repealed, effective July 1, 2024.
8	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
9	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
10	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.

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
