Bill Topic: CHILD-OCCUPIED FACILITY LEAD-BASED PAINT ABATEMENT

Summary of No fiscal impact. The bill aligns Colorado and federal law definitions of "child-occupied facility" for the purposes of lead-based paint abatement applicability.

It is assessed as having no fiscal impact on state or local government.

Appropriation Summary:

No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status:

The fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

Summary of Legislation

The bill aligns Colorado and federal law definitions of "child-occupied facility" so that a child-occupied facility is any building or portion of a building that is visited by a child two or more days a week with each visit totaling three or more hours.

State Expenditures

The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) oversees the lead abatement program in Colorado, including issuing lead abatement permits, certification and training forms, and exams. The bill's alignment of state and federal law definitions is not likely to increase the number or type of facilities subject to the requirements of a "child-occupied facility." Thus, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on March 31, 2023, and takes effect on August 7, 2023, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
