This bill shifts the authority to extend a state of disaster emergency from the Governor to the General Assembly. It increases state expenditures in any fiscal year when this requires a special legislative session.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill.

Summary of Legislation

The bill prohibits the Governor from renewing a state of disaster emergency. Instead, the bill authorizes the General Assembly, upon written request of the Governor and adoption of a joint resolution, to extend the state of disaster emergency for up to 30 additional days, and to continue extending for 30-day periods, as needed. If the General Assembly is not in session, the Governor or General Assembly may call a special session to consider extending a state of disaster emergency.

Background

Under current law, the Governor is authorized to declare a state of disaster emergency by executive order or proclamation if he finds a disaster has occurred or that a threat of a disaster is imminent. A state of disaster emergency is limited to 30 days, but can be renewed by the Governor. The General Assembly may terminate a state of disaster emergency at any time by joint resolution, after which the Governor must issue an executive order or proclamation ending a state of disaster emergency.

State Expenditures

If the Governor or General Assembly convenes a special session to extend a disaster emergency, state General Fund expenditures will increase. Funds for special sessions are included annually in legislative appropriations, so no appropriation is required.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
