The bill allows aggrieved parties to pursue legal action for workers' compensation violations under the Colorado Youth Employment Opportunity Act. The bill increases state workload on an ongoing basis.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

Summary of Legislation

This bill amends the "Colorado Youth Employment Opportunity Act of 1971" to allow aggrieved parties, including children and parents of children, to pursue legal remedies and remedies under the Workers Compensation Act.

State Expenditures

Beginning in FY 2023-24, the bill increases workload for the trial courts in the Judicial Department to handle any additional civil cases, and for the Department of Labor and Employment to handle any questions or complaints. It is assumed that any additional cases will be minimal, so the increase from the bill will be minimal and absorbable.

Effective Date

This bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on June 7, 2023. It applies to violations committed on or after July 1, 2023.
