The bill requires an annual meeting to discuss best practices in responding to reports from the Safe2Tell program. This will minimally increase state and local government workload starting in FY 2023-24.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

Summary of Legislation

The bill requires the Department of Law to annually convene a training meeting for school resource officers and school officials to discuss best practices in responding to reports from the Safe2Tell program. The department may conduct a survey on Safe2Tell operations.

State Expenditures

The Department of Law will have an increase in workload on an ongoing basis in order to conduct this annual training. This increase in workload can be accomplished within existing appropriations for the Safe2Tell program.

Local Government and School District

Local law enforcement agencies that provides school resource officers and school district officials who participate in the annual meeting will have an increase in workload, which can be accomplished within existing resources.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on April 27, 2023.
