## **Summary of Legislation**

Status:

The bill requires each county to create a merit system for the selection, retention, and promotion of their employees who are funded through the federal Wagner-Peyser Act. The bill specifies what merit system must include and requires counties to certify that their merit system complies with federal standards.

Budget Committee as part of its FY 2023-24 budget package.

#### **Local Government**

Workload may increase for counties to ensure their merit system complies with the standards in the bill; however, as county human service departments are currently required to submit annual certification to the state Department of Human Services certifying that the criteria for merit systems are being maintained, this additional workload is likely to be minimal.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
