A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING THE DISTRIBUTION AMOUNTS MADE BY THE STATE TO A SCHOOL DISTRICT DURING THE BUDGET YEAR THAT COMPRISE THE STATE'S SHARE OF A SCHOOL DISTRICT'S TOTAL PROGRAM.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under current law, the state distributes its share of a school district's total program funding in 12 approximately equal monthly payments during the budget year.

The bill changes this distribution schedule so that the state distributes its share of a school district's total program funds in a pattern

over the course of the budget year that considers the projected timing of when the district will receive the property tax component of its local share of its total program funding and is as equal as possible each month when combined with the property tax component of its local share.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

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SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-54-115, amend

(1) introductory portion as follows:

22-54-115. Distribution from state public school fund. (1) No later than June 30 of each year, the state board shall determine the amount of the state's share of the district's total program for the budget year beginning on July 1, and the total thereof for all districts. which amount shall be payable in twelve approximately equal monthly payments during such budget year; except that: THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL PAY THE UNPAID AMOUNT OF THE STATE'S SHARE OF EACH DISTRICT'S TOTAL PROGRAM TO EACH DISTRICT IN A PATTERN OVER THE REMAINING MONTHS OF THE BUDGET YEAR THAT CONSIDERS THE PROJECTED TIMING OF WHEN EACH DISTRICT RECEIVES THE DISTRICT'S PROPERTY TAX COMPONENT OF ITS TOTAL PROGRAM SO THAT THE STATE'S SHARE OF THE DISTRICT'S TOTAL PROGRAM EACH MONTH IS AN AMOUNT THAT WHEN COMBINED WITH THE DISTRICT'S PROPERTY TAX COMPONENT OF ITS TOTAL PROGRAM IS AS EQUAL MONTH TO MONTH AS MATHEMATICALLY POSSIBLE. TO DETERMINE THE PATTERN PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (1), THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL ASSUME THAT EACH DISTRICT RECEIVES THE SPECIFIC OWNERSHIP TAX COMPONENT OF THE DISTRICT'S SHARE OF ITS TOTAL PROGRAM IN TWELVE APPROXIMATELY EQUAL MONTHLY PAYMENTS BASED UPON THE ANNUAL PROJECTION AND THAT THE DISTRICT RECEIVES THE PROPERTY TAX COMPONENT OF THE

4	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-54-124, amend
5	(4)(c); and add (4)(d) as follows:
6	22-54-124. State aid for charter schools - use of state education
7	fund money - definitions. (4) (c) For the 2009-10 budget year and each
8	budget year thereafter THROUGH THE 2023-24 BUDGET YEAR, the
9	department of education shall distribute the total amount to be distributed
10	pursuant to this section to each eligible school district and eligible
11	institute charter school in twelve approximately equal monthly payments
12	during the applicable budget year in conjunction with the distribution of
13	the state's share of district total program pursuant to section 22-54-115.
14	(d) For the 2024-25 budget year and each budget year
15	THEREAFTER, THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL DISTRIBUTE THE
16	TOTAL AMOUNT TO BE DISTRIBUTED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION TO EACH
17	ELIGIBLE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND ELIGIBLE INSTITUTE CHARTER SCHOOL
18	PURSUANT TO SECTION 22-54-115.
19	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly finds,
20	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
21	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
22	the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
23	institutions.

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
