A BILL FOR AN ACT
CONCERNING THE CREATION OF THE ARIE P. TAYLOR SICKLE CELL
DISEASE OUTREACH PROGRAM TO PROVIDE SUPPORT TO
INDIVIDUALS LIVING WITH SICKLE CELL DISEASE.

## **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill creates the Arie P. Taylor sickle cell disease outreach program (outreach program) in the department of public health and environment (department). To implement the outreach program, the bill requires the department, subject to available appropriations, to contract with one or more community-based nonprofit organizations (outreach

organizations) to provide outreach and support services in the community to individuals living with sickle cell disease and their families.

The department shall contract with a third-party entity (administrator) to solicit applicants and administer the outreach program. On or before January 1, 2025, the department shall select one or more outreach organizations to implement the outreach program and shall give priority to community organizations with experience in providing services and support to the sickle cell community and that meet other criteria in the bill.

The outreach program may include informal counseling and health guidance, direction and support to individuals and their families in locating and accessing services in the community, outreach concerning activities and programs available to individuals and families living with sickle cell disease, peer support and referrals, advocacy regarding the interests of the sickle cell disease community, referrals for screening, and other services and support identified by the department.

The department shall approve the services provided through a contract and may consult with the university of Colorado school of medicine's sickle-cell anemia treatment and research center to identify needed services and supports.

Prior to the expiration of a contract, the outreach organization, in conjunction with the administrator, shall prepare and submit a written report to the department describing the impact of the outreach program provided under the contract, and the department shall provide the report to certain committees of the general assembly.

The bill repeals the outreach program after 5 years.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

8	CONTRACT, NOT TO EXCEED TWO YEARS, AND SHALL APPROVE THE
9	SERVICES AND SUPPORT TO BE INCLUDED IN A CONTRACT.
10	(d) IN AWARDING A CONTRACT, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL GIVE
11	PRIORITY TO A COMMUNITY-BASED NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION THAT:
12	(I) HAS A MINIMUM OF TEN YEARS' EXPERIENCE IN PROVIDING
13	SERVICES AND SUPPORT IN COLORADO TO INDIVIDUALS LIVING WITH
14	SICKLE CELL DISEASE AND THEIR FAMILIES, SPECIFICALLY IN THE DENVER
15	METROPOLITAN AREA OR COLORADO SPRINGS, WHICH AREAS OF THE
16	STATE HAVE THE HIGHEST NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS LIVING WITH SICKLE
17	CELL DISEASE IN COLORADO;
18	(II) HAS EXPERIENCE PROVIDING THE SERVICES AND SUPPORT
19	DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (5)(a) OF THIS SECTION; AND
20	(III) IS ENGAGED IN FUNDRAISING FOR AND RAISING AWARENESS
21	OF THE NEEDS OF INDIVIDUALS LIVING WITH SICKLE CELL DISEASE AND
22	THEIR FAMILIES AND MAINTAINS A NETWORK OF PERSONS ABLE TO
23	PROVIDE PEER ASSISTANCE AND RESOURCES TO THOSE INDIVIDUALS.
24	(5) (a) Depending upon the amount of available
25	APPROPRIATIONS AND THE NEEDS TO BE ADDRESSED THROUGH A
26	CONTRACT, THE COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES AND SUPPORT PROVIDED
27	THROUGH THE OUTREACH PROGRAM MAY INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING

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1	SERVICES AND SUPPORT PROVIDED BY A COMMUNITY-BASED NONPROFIT
2	ORGANIZATION OR BY COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKERS OR SOCIAL
3	WORKERS EMPLOYED BY THE COMMUNITY-BASED NONPROFIT
4	ORGANIZATION:
5	(I) CULTURALLY APPROPRIATE HEALTH EDUCATION AND
6	INFORMATION CONCERNING SICKLE CELL DISEASE AND LIVING WITH SICKLE
7	CELL DISEASE;
8	(II) INFORMAL COUNSELING AND GUIDANCE ON HEALTH
9	BEHAVIORS;
10	(III) DIRECTION AND SUPPORT TO INDIVIDUALS AND THEIR
11	FAMILIES IN LOCATING AND ACCESSING SERVICES IN THE COMMUNITY TO
12	ADDRESS THEIR NEEDS, INCLUDING NONMEDICAL NEEDS SUCH AS HOUSING,
13	FOOD, EDUCATION, TRANSPORTATION, EMPLOYMENT, LEGAL SERVICES,
14	AND OTHER SUPPORT;
15	(IV) OUTREACH TO THE SICKLE CELL DISEASE COMMUNITY
16	CONCERNING ACTIVITIES AND PROGRAMS AVAILABLE TO INDIVIDUALS
17	LIVING WITH THE EFFECTS OF SICKLE CELL DISEASE AND THEIR FAMILIES;
18	(V) PEER SUPPORT SERVICES AND REFERRALS FOR INDIVIDUALS
19	AND FAMILIES LIVING WITH SICKLE CELL DISEASE IN THE LOCAL
20	COMMUNITY;
21	(VI) ADVOCACY REGARDING THE INTERESTS OF THE SICKLE CELL
22	DISEASE COMMUNITY THROUGH PARTNERSHIPS WITH THE GENERAL
23	PUBLIC, STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT ENTITIES, HEALTH-CARE
24	PROVIDERS, AND OTHER COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS;
25	(VII) REFERRALS FOR SICKLE-CELL ANEMIA SCREENING; AND
26	(VIII) ANY OTHER SERVICES AND SUPPORT AS DETERMINED BY THE
27	DEPARTMENT.

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1	(b) IN DETERMINING THE SERVICES AND SUPPORT INCLUDED IN A
2	CONTRACT, THE DEPARTMENT MAY CONSULT WITH THE SICKLE-CELL
3	ANEMIA TREATMENT AND RESEARCH CENTER, CREATED IN SECTION
4	23-21-203, TO IDENTIFY THE COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES AND SUPPORT
5	THAT IS LIKELY TO HAVE THE GREATEST IMPACT ON THE INDIVIDUALS AND
6	FAMILIES SERVED THROUGH THE OUTREACH PROGRAM GIVEN THE AMOUNT
7	AND DURATION OF THE CONTRACT.
8	(6) (a) Prior to the expiration of a contract, a
9	COMMUNITY-BASED NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION IMPLEMENTING THE
10	OUTREACH PROGRAM SHALL PREPARE AND SUBMIT, IN CONJUNCTION WITH
11	THE ADMINISTRATOR, A WRITTEN REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT
12	DESCRIBING:
13	(I) THE TYPE AND AMOUNT OF SERVICES AND SUPPORT PROVIDED
14	TO THE COMMUNITY PURSUANT TO THE OUTREACH PROGRAM;
15	(II) THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES IMPACTED
16	THROUGH THE SERVICES AND SUPPORT;
17	(III) THE CHARACTERISTICS OF THE INDIVIDUALS RECEIVING
18	SERVICES AND SUPPORT, INCLUDING WHETHER THE SERVICES OR SUPPORT
19	WAS PROVIDED TO ADULTS OR CHILDREN WITH SICKLE CELL DISEASE OR
20	THEIR FAMILY MEMBERS, BUT EXCLUDING PERSONALLY IDENTIFYING
21	INFORMATION REGARDING THE INDIVIDUALS; AND
22	(IV) THE LOCATION WHERE THE SERVICES AND SUPPORT WAS
23	PROVIDED.
24	(b) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE THE REPORT TO THE HOUSE
25	OF REPRESENTATIVES PUBLIC AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AND HUMAN
26	SERVICES COMMITTEE AND THE SENATE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES
27	COMMITTEE OF THEIR SUCCESSOR COMMITTEES THE DEPARTMENT MAY

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1	INCLUDE WITH THE REPORT INFORMATION KNOWN TO THE DEPARTMENT
2	CONCERNING THE OUTCOMES OF THE SERVICES AND SUPPORT PROVIDED,
3	AS WELL AS OTHER RELEVANT INFORMATION CONCERNING THE IMPACT OF
4	THE OUTREACH PROGRAM ON INDIVIDUALS LIVING WITH SICKLE CELL
5	DISEASE AND THEIR FAMILIES.
6	(7) This section is repealed, effective July 1, 2030.
7	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly finds,
8	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
9	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
10	the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
11	institutions.

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
