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A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE COLORADO FIREFIGHTER HEART, CANCER, AND

102 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill removes the ability of a firefighter employer to select accident insurance, self-insurance, or a self-insurance pool as options to provide statutorily required monetary benefits to a firefighter who has experienced a heart and circulatory malfunction. As a result, a firefighter employer must participate in a multiple employer health trust in order to provide such benefits.







1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 29-5-302, amend (1)
and (11) as follows:

29-5-302. Required benefits - conditions of receiving benefits.
(1) (a) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (1)(b) OF THIS SECTION, an
employer shall maintain accident insurance, self-insure, or participate in
a self-insurance pool or a multiple employer health trust in order to
provide the benefits specified in this section for its firefighters. In
addition, an employer may provide equivalent benefits for volunteer
firefighters.

(b) A CITY AND COUNTY OR A MUNICIPALITY THAT, AS OF JULY
2022, HAS A POPULATION OF FOUR HUNDRED THOUSAND OR MORE PEOPLE,
AND AS OF APRIL 30, 2024, HAS ENACTED AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE THE
BENEFITS SPECIFIED IN THIS SECTION FOR ITS FIREFIGHTERS NEED NOT
PARTICIPATE IN A MULTIPLE EMPLOYER HEALTH TRUST AS REQUIRED BY
SUBSECTION (1)(a) OF THIS SECTION SO LONG AS THE ORDINANCE REMAINS
IN EFFECT.

18 (11) (a) There is hereby created in the state treasury the firefighter 19 benefits cash fund. The fund consists of moneys MONEY appropriated 20 from the general fund by the general assembly. The moneys MONEY in the 21 fund are IS subject to annual appropriation by the general assembly to the 22 department of local affairs for the purpose of reimbursing employers for 23 the direct costs of maintaining accident insurance, self-insurance, or 24 participation in a self-insurance pool or multiple employer health trust as 25 required by this part 3.



(b) The department of local affairs shall reimburse employers for

the direct costs of maintaining accident insurance, self-insurance, or
 participation in a self-insurance pool or multiple employer health trust as
 required by this part 3.

4 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 29-13-102, amend
5 (7) as follows:

6 **29-13-102.** Authority for units of local government to pool 7 insurance coverage. (7) In addition to property coverage pursuant to 8 subsection (1) of this section and liability coverage pursuant to section 9 24-10-115.5, C.R.S., a self-insurance pool authorized by subsection (1) 10 of this section may provide workers' compensation coverage pursuant to 11 section 8-44-204. C.R.S., and firefighter heart and circulatory 12 malfunction benefits pursuant to section 29-5-302.

13 SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-10-115.5, amend
14 (9) as follows:

24-10-115.5. Authority for public entities to pool insurance
coverage. (9) In addition to liability coverage pursuant to subsection (1)
of this section and property coverage pursuant to section 29-13-102,
C.R.S., a self-insurance pool authorized by subsection (1) of this section
may provide workers' compensation coverage pursuant to section
8-44-204. C.R.S., and firefighter heart and circulatory malfunction
benefits pursuant to section 29-5-302, C.R.S.

SECTION 4. Applicability. This act applies to benefits provided
on or after the ninetieth day following the effective date of this act.

SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly finds,
 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for

- 1 the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
- 2 institutions.
