HOUSE BILL 24-1033

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A BILL FOR AN ACT 101 CONCERNING THE NEEDS OF AN INDIVIDUAL WITH AN ANIMAL DURING 102 AN EMERGENCY, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, STRONGLY 103 ENCOURAGING THAT EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLANS 104 ADDRESS THE NEEDS OF AN INDIVIDUAL WITH AN ANIMAL 105 DURING AN EMERGENCY AND THAT LOCAL GOVERNMENTS MAKE 106 CERTAIN INFORMATION PUBLICLY AVAILABLE RELATING TO AN 107 INDIVIDUAL WITH AN ANIMAL DURING AN EMERGENCY.

Bill Summary

3rd Reading Unamended February 15, 2024

Wildfire Matters Review Committee. The bill strongly encourages a locally defined or interjurisdictional emergency management plan amended or created on or after July 1, 2024, to address the needs of an individual with an animal during an emergency by:

- Including provisions for the evacuation, shelter, and transport of an individual with an animal and that animal; and
- Requiring, to the extent practicable, that at least one shelter established during an emergency is designated to accommodate an individual with an animal and that animal.

The bill also strongly encourages a city, county, or city and county to make available to the public information for animal emergency preparedness, including:

- Information for creating an evacuation plan and emergency checklist for individuals with animals consistent with recommendations publicly published by the United States department of agriculture and the federal emergency management agency;
- Local organizations that may provide emergency animal assistance; and
- Local emergency shelters, cooling centers, or warming centers, when active, that can accommodate an individual with an animal.

20	AS LOWERING THE PROTECTIONS FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES,
21	INCLUDING THE RIGHT TO REMAIN WITH A SERVICE ANIMAL IN ANY
22	EMERGENCY SHELTER, PROVIDED BY THE FEDERAL "AMERICANS WITH
23	DISABILITIES ACT OF 1990", 42 U.S.C. SEC. 12101 ET SEQ., AS AMENDED,
24	AND PARTS 6 AND 8 OF ARTICLE 34 OF THIS TITLE 24.
25	(b) On or after January 1, 2025, a city, county, or city and
26	COUNTY IS STRONGLY ENCOURAGED TO MAKE AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC
27	INFORMATION FOR ANIMAL EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS, INCLUDING:

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1	(I) Information for creating an evacuation plan and
2	EMERGENCY CHECKLIST FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH ANIMALS CONSISTENT
3	WITH RECOMMENDATIONS PUBLICLY PUBLISHED BY THE UNITED STATES
4	DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY
5	MANAGEMENT AGENCY;
6	(II) LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS THAT MAY PROVIDE EMERGENCY
7	ANIMAL ASSISTANCE; AND
8	(III) LOCAL EMERGENCY SHELTERS, COOLING CENTERS, OR
9	WARMING CENTERS, WHEN ACTIVE, THAT CAN ACCOMMODATE AN
10	INDIVIDUAL WITH AN ANIMAL.
11	(c) On or after January 1, 2025, a city, county, or city and
12	COUNTY IS STRONGLY ENCOURAGED TO INCORPORATE DISABILITY
13	ETIQUETTE AND SERVICE ANIMAL TRAINING PROVIDED BY, OR WITH
14	GUIDANCE FROM, THE RELEVANT INDEPENDENT LIVING CENTER OR OTHER
15	RELEVANT TRAINING PROVIDER TO ENSURE THAT EMERGENCY RESPONSE
16	PERSONNEL ARE WELL PREPARED TO INTERACT WITH INDIVIDUALS WITH
17	DISABILITIES AND THEIR SERVICE ANIMALS DURING EMERGENCY
18	SITUATIONS.
19	(d) As used in this subsection (8.5), unless the context
20	OTHERWISE REQUIRES, "ANIMAL" MEANS BOTH A "PET ANIMAL", AS
21	DEFINED IN SECTION 38-20-101 (3.5), AND A "SERVICE ANIMAL", AS
22	DEFINED IN SECTION 12-240-144 (4)(c).
23	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly finds,
24	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
25	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
26	the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
27	institutions.

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
