101	CONCERNING THE CREATION OF THE ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICE
102	RECYCLING STRATEGIES ADVISORY GROUP TO MAKE STRATEGY

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill establishes the electronic smoking device recycling strategies advisory group (advisory group). The advisory group is tasked with conducting an analysis of methods and strategies for the recycling of single-use electronic smoking devices (devices). The advisory group shall develop a report that:

- Evaluates the extent of pollution caused by the disposal of devices;
- Reviews existing practices and capacity for the recycling of devices;
- Considers methods and strategies for recycling devices that are protective of the public health and environment;
- Considers whether Colorado should establish a deposit and recycle program that charges consumers a fee for recycling devices;
- Recommends any state or local government policies related to the recycling of devices; and
- Identifies any existing state or federal grant programs or other programs that may be available to assist in the development of strategies for the recycling of devices.

The advisory group must submit the report to the general assembly, the department of public health and environment, and the governor's office on or before October 31, 2025.

SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly

(a) The use of vaping products, referred to in this section as

"vapes", and other electronic smoking devices has increased by nearly

6 200% in recent years, with an estimated 11 million vapes being sold every

- 7 month;
- 8 (b) Many individuals are opting to use single-use electronic
 9 smoking devices for smoking both nicotine and cannabis;
- 10 (c) These single-use electronic smoking devices contain toxic and 11 hazardous substances, such as nicotine liquid, lithium batteries, lead, 12 mercury, heavy metals, volatile organic compounds, and other 13 contaminants; furthermore, the electronic smoking devices are made of 14 plastic and metal and are nonbiodegradable;

(d) There is an estimated 23.6 tons of lithium contained in the
 number of vapes sold annually in the United States, which is enough
 lithium to create about 2,600 electric vehicle batteries;

- 4 (e) Single-use electronic smoking devices are thrown away after
 5 being used, which means the hazardous substances, plastics, and metals
 6 in the vapes and cartridges make it into Colorado's landfills or end up as
 7 litter in streets, parks, groundwater, and waterways;
- 8 (f) It is estimated that consumers in the United States throw away
 9 more than 4 disposable vapes every second;
- (g) Depending on the amount of nicotine in an electronic smoking
 device, some vapes may be considered hazardous waste according to the
 United States Environmental Protection Agency;
- (h) For the single-use electronic smoking devices that do make it
 into landfills, the landfill facility operators do not have clear guidance or
 equipment for recycling the vapes; some landfills opt to bury the devices
 and others put the devices into an incinerator;
- 17 (i) There is currently no standardized method for recycling18 single-use electronic smoking devices; and
- (j) Retailers who sell single-use electronic smoking devices,
 consumers, landfill facility operators, and electronic smoking device
 manufacturers need guidelines and options for recycling vapes and other
 electronic smoking devices so that the devices do not pollute Colorado's
 streets, parks, groundwater, and waterways.
- (2) The general assembly further finds and declares that it is in
 Colorado's best interest to convene an advisory group to recommend
 strategies for the recycling of single-use electronic smoking devices.
- 27 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 25-16.5-114 as

(1) As used in this section, unless the context otherwise 5 **REQUIRES:** 6 (a) "ADVISORY GROUP" MEANS THE ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICE 7 RECYCLING STRATEGIES ADVISORY GROUP CREATED IN SUBSECTION (2) OF 8 THIS SECTION. 9 (b) "ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICE" HAS THE MEANING SET FORTH 10 IN SECTION 25-14-203 (4.5). 11 (c) "EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR" MEANS THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF 12 THE DEPARTMENT. 13 (d) "RECYCLE" OR "RECYCLING" HAS THE MEANING SET FORTH IN 14 SECTION 25-17-302 (7). 15 (e) "SINGLE-USE ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICE" DOES NOT 16 INCLUDE AN ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICE THAT IS DESIGNED TO BE USED 17 MORE THAN ONCE BY THE CONSUMER AND THAT CONTAINS A REFILLABLE 18 CARTRIDGE AND RECHARGEABLE BATTERY. 19 (2) THE ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICE RECYCLING STRATEGIES 20 ADVISORY GROUP IS CREATED IN THE DEPARTMENT. 21 (3) THE ADVISORY GROUP CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING TEN 22 MEMBERS, APPOINTED BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR: 23 ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS THE NICOTINE-BASED (a) 24 SINGLE-USE ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICE INDUSTRY; 25 TWO MEMBERS WHO REPRESENT THE CANNABIS-BASED (b)26 SINGLE-USE ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICE INDUSTRY; 27 (c) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS SINGLE-USE ELECTRONIC

1 SMOKING DEVICE RETAILERS;

2 (d) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT
3 THAT IS AN INDEPENDENTLY OWNED CONVENIENCE STORE;
4 (e) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS THE DEPARTMENT AND WHO
5 SPECIALIZES IN ELECTRONIC WASTE RECYCLING;

6 (f) Two MEMBERS WHO REPRESENT WASTE HAULERS, AS DEFINED
7 IN SECTION 30-20-1001 (16);

8 (g) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS A WASTE RECYCLING FACILITY
9 THAT RECYCLES ELECTRONIC WASTE; AND

10 (h) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS A COLORADO ORGANIZATION
11 FOCUSED ON ENVIRONMENTAL CLEANUP AND THE MITIGATION OF
12 ENVIRONMENTAL POLLUTION.

13 (4) (a) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL APPOINT THE MEMBERS
14 OF THE ADVISORY GROUP PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION
15 ON OR BEFORE AUGUST 1, 2024.

16 (b) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL CALL THE FIRST MEETING OF
17 THE ADVISORY GROUP, WHICH MEETING MUST OCCUR ON OR BEFORE
18 OCTOBER 31, 2024.

19 (c) AT THE FIRST MEETING OF THE ADVISORY GROUP, THE
20 ADVISORY GROUP SHALL ELECT, BY A SIMPLE MAJORITY VOTE, A CHAIR
21 AND VICE-CHAIR FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS.

22 (d) (I) THE ADVISORY GROUP SHALL MEET AT LEAST THREE TIMES
23 BEFORE AUGUST 1, 2025.

24 (II) THE CHAIR OF THE ADVISORY GROUP MAY CALL ADDITIONAL25 MEETINGS AS NECESSARY.

26 (5) THE ADVISORY GROUP SHALL ANALYZE INFORMATION,
27 METHODS, STRATEGIES, AND POLICIES RELATED TO THE RECYCLING OF

1 SINGLE-USE ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES. THE ANALYSIS MUST:

2 (a) EVALUATE THE EXTENT OF POLLUTION THAT IS CAUSED BY THE
3 DISPOSAL OF SINGLE-USE ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES IN LANDFILLS;

4 (b) REVIEW EXISTING PRACTICES FOR THE RECYCLING OF
5 SINGLE-USE ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES;

6 (c) EXAMINE THE CAPACITY FOR EXISTING RECYCLING FACILITIES
7 IN COLORADO TO RECYCLE SINGLE-USE ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES;
8 (d) CONSIDER METHODS AND STRATEGIES FOR RECYCLING
9 SINGLE-USE ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES THAT ENSURE THE
10 HAZARDOUS WASTE AND OTHER MATERIALS ASSOCIATED WITH
11 ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES DO NOT POLLUTE COLORADO'S
12 ENVIRONMENT;

13 (e) CONSIDER WHETHER COLORADO SHOULD ESTABLISH A DEPOSIT
14 AND RECYCLE PROGRAM WHEREBY SINGLE-USE ELECTRONIC SMOKING
15 DEVICE RETAILERS CHARGE A FEE TO CUSTOMERS THAT WOULD BE USED
16 FOR COLLECTING, TRANSPORTING, AND RECYCLING SINGLE-USE
17 ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES;

18 (f) RECOMMEND ANY STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT POLICIES OR
19 PROGRAMS RELATED TO THE RECYCLING OF SINGLE-USE ELECTRONIC
20 SMOKING DEVICES; AND

(g) IDENTIFY ANY EXISTING STATE OR FEDERAL GRANT PROGRAMS
OR OTHER PROGRAMS THAT MAY BE AVAILABLE TO ASSIST IN THE
DEVELOPMENT OF STRATEGIES FOR THE RECYCLING OF SINGLE-USE
ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES IN COLORADO.

(6) (a) THE ADVISORY GROUP SHALL DEVELOP A REPORT
REGARDING ANY FINDINGS, STRATEGIES, OR RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE
RECYCLING OF SINGLE-USE ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES PURSUANT TO

THE ANALYSIS CONDUCTED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (5) OF THIS
 SECTION.

3 (b) NO LATER THAN OCTOBER 31, 2025, THE ADVISORY GROUP
4 SHALL SUBMIT THE REPORT DEVELOPED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (6)(a)
5 OF THIS SECTION TO THE SENATE BUSINESS, LABOR, AND TECHNOLOGY
6 COMMITTEE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES BUSINESS AFFAIRS AND
7 LABOR COMMITTEE, OR ANY SUCCESSOR COMMITTEES, THE EXECUTIVE
8 DIRECTOR, AND THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE.

9 (7) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE ANY ADMINISTRATIVE 10 SUPPORT TO THE ADVISORY GROUP AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT 11 THIS SECTION. THE DEPARTMENT MAY SEEK, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND GIFTS, 12 GRANTS, OR DONATIONS FROM PRIVATE OR PUBLIC SOURCES FOR THE 13 PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION.

(8) THIS SECTION IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 2026.
SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
institutions.
