Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill requires the department of labor and employment (department), in consultation with the department of military and veterans affairs, to create and distribute a poster that provides information on services, resources, and benefits that are available to veterans of the armed services.

Each employer in this state with more than 50 employees is required to display the poster created by the department in a conspicuous and accessible area in the workplace.

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2	(2) BEGINNING JANUARY $1,2025$, EACH EMPLOYER IN THIS STATE
3	WITH MORE THAN FIFTY FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES SHALL DISPLAY THE
4	POSTER CREATED AND DISTRIBUTED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS
5	SECTION IN A CONSPICUOUS PLACE THAT IS EASILY ACCESSIBLE TO ALL

SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
