### **Bill Summary**

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

- SECTION 1. Appropriation to the department of public safety for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023. In Session Laws of Colorado 2023, section 2 of chapter 474, (SB 23-214), amend Part XVIII as follows:

Department of Public Safety, Division of Criminal Justice, Community Corrections, Community Corrections Facility Payments -- The amount of the appropriation assumes that the Department will provide an equal payment to all programs, with the exception that facilities with an average of 32 or more security FTE will receive a second facility payment.
