A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE CREATION OF A SEPARATE HEALTH FACILITY
102 LICENSE FOR CRITICAL ACCESS HOSPITALS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

Currently, certain rural hospitals must be licensed as general hospitals under state law and under federal law are designated as critical access hospitals.

The bill:

• Authorizes the department of public health and environment (department) to license critical access

- hospitals separately from general hospitals;
- Prohibits a person from operating a critical access hospital without a license; and
- Requires the department to promulgate rules concerning the licensure of critical access hospitals.

6	any A governmental unit or agency, without first having obtained a
7	license from the department.

(c) (I) In accordance with the redistributive method 15 set forth in 42 CFR 433.68 (e)(1) and (e)(2), the enterprise, acting in 16 concert with or through an agreement with the state department if 17 required by federal law, may seek a waiver from the broad-based 18 healthcare affordability and sustainability fee requirement or the uniform 19 healthcare affordability and sustainability fee requirement, or both. In 20 addition, the enterprise, acting in concert with or through an agreement 21 with the state department if required by federal law, shall seek any federal 22 waiver necessary to fund and, in cooperation with the state department 23 and hospitals, support the implementation of a health-care delivery system 24 reform incentive payments program as described in subsection (8) of this

section. Subject to federal approval and to minimize the financial impact

on certain hospitals, the enterprise may exempt from payment of the

healthcare affordability and sustainability fee certain types of hospitals,

14	SECTION 8. Act subject to petition - effective date. (1) Except
15	as specified in subsection (2) of this section, this act takes effect at 12:01
16	a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after
17	final adjournment of the general assembly; except that, if a referendum
18	petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state
19	constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within
20	such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless
21	approved by the people at the general election to be held in November
22	2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official
23	declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
