A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING AN EVALUATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HIGHER EDUCATION'S INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY FUNCTIONS AND SERVICES BY THE OFFICE OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY, AND,

Bill Summary

IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

The office is required to complete this evaluation by November 1, 2024. If the evaluation shows that consolidation would be beneficial, the office shall create a proposed plan and accompanying budget for consolidating the information technology functions and services of the department of higher education with those information technology functions and services managed by the office. For the 2024-25 state fiscal year, \$280,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the office to implement the act.

23	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly finds,

26	the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
