Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Joint Budget Committee. The bill makes 3 changes to the funding and administration of the multidisciplinary crime prevention and crisis intervention grant program. The bill:

HOUSE Amended 2nd Reading March 28, 2024

- Requires the state treasurer to transfer \$3 million from the general fund to the multidisciplinary crime prevention and crisis intervention grant fund on July 1, 2024;
- Modifies the multidisciplinary crime prevention and crisis intervention grant fund so that money in the fund is annually, rather than continuously, appropriated; and
- Extends the repeal date of the multidisciplinary crime prevention and crisis intervention grant program, grant fund, and advisory committee from January 1, 2025, to July 1, 2027.

The bill also modifies both the law enforcement workforce recruitment, retention, and tuition grant fund and the SMART policing grant fund so that money in both funds is annually, rather than continuously, appropriated.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:* 2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-31-903, amend 3 (5) as follows: 4 **Division of criminal justice report.** (5) 24-31-903. The 5 Colorado state patrol and any local law enforcement agency that fails to 6 meet its reporting requirements pursuant to this section is: 7 (a) Subject to the suspension of its funding by its appropriating 8 authority; AND 9 (b) UNLESS THE COLORADO STATE PATROL OR LOCAL LAW 10 ENFORCEMENT AGENCY IS WORKING WITH THE DIVISION OF CRIMINAL 11 JUSTICE TO MEET ITS REPORTING REQUIREMENTS PURSUANT TO THIS 12 SECTION, NOT ELIGIBLE TO BE AWARDED GRANTS UNDER THE 13 MULTIDISCIPLINARY CRIME PREVENTION GRANT PROGRAM IN SECTION 14 24-33.5-527, THE LAW ENFORCEMENT WORKFORCE RECRUITMENT, 15 RETENTION, AND TUITION GRANT PROGRAM IN SECTION 24-33.5-528, OR 16 THE STATE'S MISSION FOR ASSISTANCE IN RECRUITING AND TRAINING 17 (SMART) POLICING GRANT PROGRAM IN SECTION 24-33.5-529.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-527, amend
 (4)(a) and (6); and add (4)(c.5) as follows:

3 24-33.5-527. Multidisciplinary crime prevention and crisis 4 intervention grant program - committee - fund - reports - repeal. 5 (4) (a) There is created in the state treasury the multidisciplinary crime prevention and crisis intervention grant fund, referred to in this section as 6 7 the "fund", consisting of any money appropriated to the fund by the 8 general assembly and any money received by the division from gifts, 9 grants, or donations for the grant program. The money in the fund is 10 continuously appropriated to the division SUBJECT TO ANNUAL 11 APPROPRIATION BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, THE DIVISION MAY EXPEND MONEY FROM THE FUND for the direct and indirect costs associated with 12 13 implementing the grant program.

14 (c.5) (I) ON JULY 1,2024, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER
 15 THREE MILLION DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE FUND.

- 16 (II) THIS SUBSECTION (4)(c.5) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
 17 2025.
- 18 (6) This section is repealed, effective January 1, 2025 JULY 1,
 19 2027.

20 SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-528, amend
21 (4)(a) as follows:

22 24-33.5-528. Law enforcement workforce recruitment,
23 retention, and tuition grant program - committee - fund - reports 24 repeal. (4) (a) There is created in the state treasury the law enforcement
25 workforce recruitment, retention, and tuition grant fund, referred to in this
26 section as the "fund", consisting of any money appropriated to the fund
27 by the general assembly and any money received by the division from

gifts, grants, or donations for the grant program. The money in the fund
 is continuously appropriated to the division SUBJECT TO ANNUAL
 APPROPRIATION BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, THE DIVISION MAY EXPEND
 MONEY FROM THE FUND for the direct and indirect costs associated with
 implementing the grant program.

6 SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-529, amend
7 (4)(a) as follows:

8 24-33.5-529. State's mission for assistance in recruiting and 9 training (SMART) grant program - committee - fund - reports -10 definitions - repeal. (4) (a) There is created in the state treasury the 11 SMART policing grant fund, referred to in this section as the "fund", 12 consisting of any money appropriated to the fund by the general assembly 13 and any money received by the division from gifts, grants, or donations 14 for the SMART policing program. The money in the fund is continuously 15 appropriated to the division SUBJECT TO ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BY THE 16 GENERAL ASSEMBLY, THE DIVISION MAY EXPEND MONEY FROM THE FUND 17 for the direct and indirect costs associated with implementing the 18 SMART policing program.

19 **SECTION 5.** Appropriation. (1) For the 2024-25 state fiscal 20 year, \$14,493,178 is appropriated to the department of public safety for 21 use by the division of criminal justice. This appropriation consists of 22 \$7,031,919 from the SMART policing grant fund created in section 23 24-33.5-529 (4)(a), C.R.S., \$3,868,229 from the multidisciplinary crime 24 prevention and crisis intervention grant fund created in section 25 24-33.5-527 (4)(a), C.R.S., and \$3,593,030 from the law enforcement 26 workforce recruitment, retention, and tuition grant fund created in section 27 24-33.5-528 (4)(a), C.R.S. To implement this act, the division may use

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1 this appropriation as follows:

2 (a) \$7,031,919 from the SMART policing grant fund for the direct
3 and indirect costs associated with implementing the SMART policing
4 grant program;

5 (b) \$3,868,229 from the multidisciplinary crime prevention and 6 crisis intervention grant fund for the direct and indirect costs associated 7 with implementing the multidisciplinary crime prevention and crisis 8 intervention grant program; and

9 (c) \$3,593,030 from the law enforcement workforce recruitment, 10 retention, and tuition grant fund for the direct and indirect costs 11 associated with implementing the law enforcement workforce 12 recruitment, retention, and tuition grant program.

SECTION 6. Safety clause. The general assembly finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
institutions.
