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**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101      **CONCERNING A TRANSFER FROM THE UNUSED STATE-OWNED REAL**  
102      **PROPERTY FUND TO THE GENERAL FUND.**

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**Bill Summary**

**Joint Budget Committee.** The bill requires the state treasurer to transfer \$120,000 from the unused state-owned real property fund to the general fund on July 1, 2024.

1           **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-82-102.5, **add**  
2 (5)(d)(III) as follows:

3           **24-82-102.5. Unused state-owned real property - cash fund -**  
4 **legislative declaration - definitions - repeal.** (5) (d) (III) (A) ON JULY  
5 1, 2024, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER ONE HUNDRED TWENTY  
6 THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE FUND TO THE GENERAL FUND.

7           (B) THIS SUBSECTION (5)(d)(III) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1,  
8 2025.

9           **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly finds,  
10 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate  
11 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for  
12 the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state  
13 institutions.
