A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING EXCHANGING MONEY RECEIVED FROM THE FEDERAL

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <u>http://leg.colorado.gov/</u>.) Joint Budget Committee. The state received money from the federal coronavirus state fiscal recovery fund pursuant to the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" (ARPA money). ARPA money was deposited into the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" cash fund and then transferred to various cash funds (recipient funds) and appropriated for various programs.

The bill requires the state treasurer to transfer specified amounts of ARPA money from specified recipient funds at the close of the 2023-24 state fiscal year to the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" cash fund. The bill requires the state treasurer to transfer money from the general fund to a new ARPA refinance state money cash fund. Money in the new ARPA refinance state money cash fund is transferred to the specified recipient funds.

The bill requires the general assembly to appropriate ARPA money from the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" cash fund to state departments for personal services in fiscal year 2023-24. For fiscal year 2024-25, the general assembly shall appropriate the balance of the cash fund for personal services or for other purposes permitted under the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021", and the money so appropriated must be expended on or before January 31, 2025.

On December 1, 2024, any unspent and unobligated money in a recipient fund, other than money designated for personal services or operating costs that will be spent by January 31, 2025, reverts to the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" cash fund. The reverted money is continuously appropriated to any department designated by the governor for any purpose that was funded with general fund money in the general appropriations act for fiscal year 2024-25.

After December 31, 2024, any ARPA money in a recipient fund that was obligated as of December 31, 2024, but not expended on an eligible activity at the conclusion of the appropriation reverts to the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" cash fund and is continuously appropriated to any department designated by the governor for any purpose for which a general fund appropriation was made in the general appropriation act for the state fiscal year in which the reversion occurred.

The amount of general fund money appropriated in a line item in a general appropriations act is reduced by the amount of ARPA money appropriated pursuant to the bill's provisions that is spent for the line item.

The bill repeals the requirement for a subrecipient to obligate ARPA money by November 30, 2024.

The bill authorizes the state controller to take certain measures to implement the bill and ensure that ARPA money is expended within the time allowed by federal law. The governor and the state controller shall jointly submit a report to the joint budget committee, the speaker of the house of representatives, the minority leader of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, and the minority leader of the senate about the transfers in the bill and about spending ARPA money.

The bill makes changes to various programs related to refinancing ARPA money, including clarifying spending and obligation deadlines for program money that is not ARPA money and exempting the use of state money from requirements for capitol construction projects that use federal money. The bill makes changes to appropriations.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 SECTION 1. Legislative declaration - legislative intent. 3 (1) The general assembly finds and declares that: 4 The state received money from the federal government (a) 5 pursuant to the federal "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" (ARPA 6 money), and federal law requires that money to be obligated by December 7 31, 2024, and spent by December 31, 2026; 8 (b) ARPA money not obligated by December 31, 2024, must be 9 returned to the federal government; 10 (c) The state appropriated ARPA money for a number of programs 11 and purposes, but appropriating money is not an obligation for the 12 purposes of federal law; and 13 (d) To preserve the greatest flexibility for the state after December 14 31, 2024, and to ensure the uninterrupted implementation of programs, it 15 is in the best interest of the state to spend ARPA money before December 16 31, 2024, on eligible ARPA uses and substitute state funds for programs 17 that extend beyond December 31, 2024, and on personal services, as 18 permitted by federal law, before January 31, 2025. (2) It is the general assembly's intent that: 19 20 (a) Most of the ARPA money appropriated for programs intended 21 to be spent after December 31, 2024, be substituted with state money,

changing the source of program funds while maintaining funding for the
 programs;

3 (b) This act does not change the requirements, timelines, or4 spending deadlines for any program; and

5 (c) The exchanged ARPA money be spent on personal services 6 retroactively in fiscal year 2023-24 and in the first half of fiscal year 7 2024-25 so that all of the state's unobligated ARPA money will be spent 8 by the end of 2024, ensuring compliance with federal deadlines.

(4) (a) (I) The general assembly shall not appropriate money from
the fund EXCEPT AS DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION (4)(a) AND
SUBSECTION (5)(f) OF THIS SECTION. The general assembly may transfer
money in the fund to another cash fund that is established for the purpose
of using the money from the federal coronavirus state fiscal recovery

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fund. Transfers from the fund to the general fund are prohibited. A
 DEPARTMENT SHALL NOT USE MONEY APPROPRIATED PURSUANT TO THIS
 SUBSECTION (4) FOR ANY PURPOSE PROHIBITED BY THE "AMERICAN
 RESCUE PLAN ACT OF 2021". A DEPARTMENT SHALL COMPLY WITH ALL
 REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH IN THIS SECTION.

6 (II) If there is any of the money transferred to the fund under 7 subsection (3)(a) of this section remaining in the fund after any transfers 8 from the fund required by bills enacted during the 2021 regular legislative 9 session, then, of the remainder in the fund, the lesser of three hundred 10 million dollars or the remainder IS PLACED IN THE DISCRETIONARY 11 ACCOUNT, WHICH IS CREATED IN THE FUND, AND is continuously 12 appropriated to any department designated by the governor for any 13 allowable purpose under the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021".

(III) The money specified in subsection (3)(d) of this section IS
PLACED IN THE DISCRETIONARY ACCOUNT AND is continuously
appropriated to any department designated by the governor for any
expenditures necessary to respond to the public health emergency with
respect to COVID-19.

(IV) FOR THE 2023-24 STATE FISCAL YEAR, THE GENERAL
ASSEMBLY SHALL APPROPRIATE MONEY FROM THE FUND TO ANY
DEPARTMENTS FOR PERSONAL SERVICES THAT WERE PAID FROM THE
GENERAL FUND IN STATE FISCAL YEAR 2023-24.

(V) FOR THE 2024-25 STATE FISCAL YEAR, THE GENERAL
ASSEMBLY SHALL APPROPRIATE THE BALANCE OF THE FUND, EXCLUDING
MONEY REMAINING IN THE DISCRETIONARY ACCOUNT. THE GENERAL
ASSEMBLY MAY MAKE THE REQUIRED APPROPRIATIONS TO ANY

5 (c) (I) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, in 6 order to ensure proper accounting for and compliance with the "American 7 Rescue Plan Act of 2021", whenever money is transferred or appropriated 8 to a recipient fund that also has money from other sources, the state 9 controller or department controller shall create a companion cash fund 10 that includes only the money the state received from the federal 11 coronavirus state fiscal recovery fund under section 9901 of title IX, 12 subtitle M of the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021", but that is 13 otherwise legally identical to the recipient fund, except as otherwise 14 provided in subsection (4)(c)(II) of this section. The 17 subrecipient shall return to the state any unexpended and unobligated 18 money under terms dictated by the state controller, and the state treasurer 19 shall transfer the amount returned to the unemployment compensation 20 fund created in section 8-77-101 (1). Any money obligated by November 21 30, 2024, must be expended by December 11, 2026. On or before 22 December 11, 2026, the subrecipient shall return to the state any 23 remaining money under terms dictated by the state controller and 24 thereafter the state controller shall transmit the money to the United States 25 department of the treasury in accordance with the treasury's requirements. 26 MONEY IN THE FUND OR IN A RECIPIENT FUND THAT (III) 27 ORIGINATED FROM THE CORONAVIRUS STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND IS

1 OBLIGATED WHEN IT IS OBLIGATED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE "AMERICAN 2 RESCUE PLAN ACT OF 2021" AND ANY FEDERAL RULES PROMULGATED 3 THEREUNDER. THE OBLIGATION CRITERIA IN THE "AMERICAN RESCUE 4 Plan Act of 2021" and federal rules do not apply to money in the 5 FUND OR IN A RECIPIENT FUND THAT DID NOT ORIGINATE FROM THE 6 CORONAVIRUS STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND. MONEY THAT DID NOT 7 ORIGINATE FROM THE CORONAVIRUS STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND THAT 8 IS NOT OBLIGATED BY AN APPLICABLE DEADLINE IN STATE LAW DOES NOT 9 REVERT AND REMAINS AVAILABLE FOR EXPENDITURE IN ACCORDANCE 10 WITH ANY APPLICABLE APPROPRIATION. The state controller shall 11 determine whether money is obligated for purposes of determining the 12 deadline for expenditures and the reversion or repayment of money in 13 accordance with this subsection (4)(d).

SECTION 85. Effective date. This act takes effect upon passage;
 except that sections 52 to 65 and 81 of this act take effect only if House
 Bill 24-____ becomes law, in which case sections 52 to 65 and 81 take
 effect upon the effective date of this act or House Bill 24-____,
 whichever is later.

6 SECTION 86. Safety clause. The general assembly finds, 7 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 8 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for 9 the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state 10 institutions.
