**Joint Budget Committee.** The bill discontinues the allocation of a portion of premium tax revenues to the health insurance affordability cash fund, starting in the current fiscal year.

6	health insurance affordability cash fund. The fund consists of:

8	pursuant to section 10-3-209 (4)(a)(III) IN THE 2020-21, 2021-22, AND			
9	2022-23 STATE FISCAL YEARS, not to exceed, in any year, ten percent of			
10	the total amount the enterprise collects from carriers and hospitals under			
11	section 10-16-1205 (1)(a).			
12	(II) This subsection (1)(c) is repealed, effective July 1, 2025.			
13	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 10-3-209, amend			
14	(4)(a)(III)(A); and add (4)(a)(III)(C) as follows:			
15	10-3-209. Tax on premiums collected - exemptions - penalties			
16	- repeal. (4) (a) The division of insurance shall transmit all taxes,			
17	penalties, and fines it collects under this section to the state treasurer for			
18	deposit in the general fund; except that the state treasurer shall deposit			
19	amounts in the specified cash funds as follows:			
20	(III) (A) For the 2020-21, 2021-22, AND 2022-23 state fiscal <del>year</del>			
21	and each state fiscal year thereafter YEARS, in the health insurance			
22	affordability cash fund created in section 10-16-1206, an amount equal
