A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE AUTHORITY OF HISTORY COLORADO TO DISPOSE OF

102 ITS NORTH STORAGE FACILITY.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Capital Development Committee. The bill grants the state historical society, also known as history Colorado, the authority to sell the real property that is referred to as its north storage property. The bill specifies that history Colorado is required to credit the proceeds of the sale to the state museum cash fund to be used for moving, retrofitting, and lease-related costs for a new storage facility that history Colorado will







lease in the future or for controlled maintenance.

- 1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
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SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly finds and declares that:

4 (a) In 2011, the state historical society, also known as history 5 Colorado, acquired property that is referred to as the north storage facility 6 (facility), which is the current collections storage facility and the state 7 historical fund document repository. Initially, history Colorado intended 8 to use the facility for temporary storage of large items in the collection 9 while the history Colorado center was built, but it became clear that the 10 storage space was still needed to house the collection and the facility was 11 switched to permanent storage.

(b) The collection has continued to grow and there are currently 85,000 square feet of artifacts, which is more square footage than the facility adequately provides, making it too small to meet the storage and care needs of history Colorado. Additionally, issues with the different building systems, including electrical, mechanical, and fire suppression, make it difficult to maintain an optimal care environment for the collection.

(c) History Colorado has determined that, due to these challenges, the facility is no longer a suitable facility for the consolidated collections, care, and storage necessary to house significant artifacts that history Colorado is statutorily responsible for collecting and preserving on the state's behalf. The disposition of the property will be in the best interest of the organization and allow history Colorado to lease a more suitable facility for ongoing storage and care of the collection and to provide current and future controlled maintenance needs of all of history
 Colorado's community and historic sites.

3 SECTION 2. History Colorado authority to dispose of real 4 property. (1) The state, acting by and through the state historical society, 5 also known as history Colorado, is authorized to dispose of real property 6 located at 1100 W. 47th Ave., Denver, Colorado 80211, lots 13 to 36 7 inclusive & vacated alley interjacent thereto block 13 Richards 8 subdivision & NLY 8 1/2 feet of vacated Alice Place adjacent to 25 9 through 36 in SD block, City and County of Denver, state of Colorado.

(2) The capital development committee and the state controller
must approve all agreements relating to the disposition of the real
property described in subsection (1) of this section prior to closing.

(3) History Colorado shall credit the proceeds of the disposition
of the real property described in subsection (1) of this section to the state
museum cash fund created in section 24-80-214, Colorado Revised
Statutes, to be used for moving, retrofitting, <u>lease-related, and acquisition</u>
costs for a new storage facility that history Colorado will lease in the
future or for controlled maintenance.

19 **SECTION 3.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 20 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 21 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except 22 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V 23 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take 24 25 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 26 November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 27 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
