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A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING GENDER-RELATED CHANGES TO CRIMES THAT INVOLVE BIAS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill adds gender identity and gender expression to the classes identified in bias-motivated crimes and harassment. The bill redefines sexual orientation for purposes of bias-motivated crimes as an individual's identity, or another individual's perception thereof, in relation to the gender or genders to which the individual is sexually or emotionally attracted and the behavior or social affiliation that may result from the

attraction.

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-9-121, amend (2)
3	introductory portion and (5)(b) as follows:
4	18-9-121. Bias-motivated crimes. (2) A person commits a
5	bias-motivated crime if, with the intent to intimidate or harass another
6	person, in whole or in part, because of that person's actual or perceived
7	race; color; religion; ancestry; national origin; physical or mental
8	disability; or sexual orientation; he or she GENDER IDENTITY, AS DEFINED
9	IN SECTION 2-4-401; OR GENDER EXPRESSION, AS DEFINED IN SECTION
10	2-4-401, THE PERSON:
11	(5) For purposes of this section:
12	(b) "Sexual orientation" means a person's actual or perceived
13	orientation toward heterosexuality, homosexuality, bisexuality, or
14	transgender status AN INDIVIDUAL'S IDENTITY, OR ANOTHER INDIVIDUAL'S
15	PERCEPTION THEREOF, IN RELATION TO THE GENDER OR GENDERS TO
16	WHICH THE INDIVIDUAL IS SEXUALLY OR EMOTIONALLY ATTRACTED AND
17	THE BEHAVIOR OR SOCIAL AFFILIATION THAT MAY RESULT FROM THE
18	ATTRACTION.
19	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-9-111, amend
20	(2)(a) as follows:
21	18-9-111. Harassment - Kiana Arellano's Law. (2) (a) A
22	person who violates subsection (1)(a) or (1)(c) of this section or violates
23	any provision of subsection (1) of this section with the intent to intimidate
24	or harass another person, in whole or in part, because of that person's
25	actual or perceived race; color; religion; ancestry; national origin;

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1	physical or mental disability, as defined in section 18-9-121; (5)(a); or
2	sexual orientation, as defined in section 18-9-121; (5)(b), GENDER
3	IDENTITY, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 2-4-401; OR GENDER EXPRESSION, AS
4	DEFINED IN SECTION 2-4-401, commits a class 1 misdemeanor.
5	SECTION 3. Effective date - applicability. This act takes effect
6	July 1, 2024, and applies to offenses committed on or after said date.
7	SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly finds,
8	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
9	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
10	the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
11	institutions.

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
