### A BILL FOR AN ACT

#### 101 CONCERNING CHANGES TO THE PHARMACY PRACTICE ACT RELATING

102 TO THE DISPENSING OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.

#### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <u>http://leg.colorado.gov</u>.)

The bill makes changes to the pharmacy practice act regarding the dispensing of prescription drugs by pharmacists, pharmacy technicians, and pharmacy interns.

The bill allows prescription drugs dispensed through an automated pharmacy dispensing system to be redispensed if certain safety requirements are met. The bill also allows pharmacists certified in immunization, and pharmacy technicians and pharmacy interns working under the direct supervision of a pharmacist certified in immunization, to administer vaccines and other related emergency medications.

Current law defines the practice of pharmacy to allow pharmacists to exercise independent prescriptive authority under certain conditions for patients who are at least 12 years of age. The bill removes the age limitation.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-280-103, amend

4 repeal (50)(a)(II) and (50)(c)(I); and add (17.5), (22.5), (38.5)(a)(X),

5 (38.5)(a)(XI), (38.5)(a)(XII), and (39)(l) as follows:

(17.5) "FINAL EVALUATION" MEANS:

10 (a) THE REVIEW OF THE FINAL PRESCRIPTION MAY INCLUDE THE
11 INVOLVEMENT OF A SUPERVISED, APPOINTED, AND CERTIFIED PHARMACY
12 TECHNICIAN OR PHARMACY INTERN OPERATING UNDER THE DIRECT
13 SUPERVISION OF AN ON-DUTY PHARMACIST TO ENSURE THAT THE
14 PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION IS PROPERLY PREPARED AND PLACED IN A
15 SUITABLE CONTAINER WITH APPROPRIATE LABELING;

16 (b) ENSURING THAT THE IDENTITY OF THE DRUG THAT APPEARS ON
17 THE PRESCRIPTION LABEL CORRESPONDS WITH THE DRUG IN THE
18 CONTAINER IN WHICH IT IS DISPENSED; AND

(c) A REVIEW IN COMPLIANCE WITH A POLICY MANUAL RELATED TO
 PHARMACY TECHNICIAN AND PHARMACY INTERN SUPERVISION THAT IS
 MAINTAINED, REVIEWED AND UPDATED ANNUALLY, IN COMPLIANCE WITH

APPLICABLE RULES, AND ENSURES THE ACCURACY AND SAFETY OF THE
 PRESCRIPTION DRUG DISPENSING, INCLUDING A PROCEDURE FOR
 MAINTAINING QUALITY ASSURANCE.

20 CERTIFIED IN IMMUNIZATION AND COMPLIES WITH STANDARDS

(XII) REQUESTING REFILL AUTHORIZATION FROM THE PRESCRIBER
 OR PRESCRIBER'S AGENT AND RECEIVING NEW OR OMITTED PRESCRIPTION
 INFORMATION FROM THE PRESCRIBER OR PRESCRIBER'S AGENT.

26 (g) Exercising independent prescriptive authority:

27 (IV) For drugs that are not controlled substances, drug categories,

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or devices that are prescribed TO PATIENTS in accordance with the
 product's FDA-approved labeling and to patients who are at least twelve
 years of age and that are limited to conditions that:

4 (j) Performing other tasks delegated by a licensed physician; and
5 (k) Providing treatment that is based on national, evidence-based,
6 published guidance; AND

7 (1) FOR A PHARMACIST CERTIFIED IN IMMUNIZATION, THE
8 ADMINISTRATION OF A VACCINE AND OTHER RELATED EMERGENCY
9 MEDICATION IF THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE VACCINE OR RELATED

  that details changes in state law, INCLUDING CHANGES OUTSIDE OF THIS
  ARTICLE 280, that affect or are pertinent to the practice of pharmacy.
  SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-280-141, amend
- 27 (9); and **add** (3.5) as follows:

12-280-141. Prescription drugs - automated pharmacy
 dispensing system - rules - definition. (3.5) A PHARMACIST, PHARMACY
 TECHNICIAN, OR PHARMACY INTERN RESPONSIBLE FOR THE FINAL
 EVALUATION OF A PRESCRIPTION DRUG DISPENSED THROUGH AN
 AUTOMATED PHARMACY DISPENSING SYSTEM IS ACCOUNTABLE FOR THE
 ACCURACY OF THE PRODUCT DISPENSED THROUGH THE SYSTEM.

(9) (a) All prescription drugs stored in an automated pharmacy
dispensing system are part of the inventory of the prescription drug outlet
operating the system, and all prescription drugs dispensed from the
system are considered to have been dispensed by the prescription drug
outlet that operates the system.

12 (b) A PRESCRIPTION DRUG THAT HAS BEEN DISPENSED BY AN 13 AUTOMATED DISPENSING SYSTEM MAY BE RETURNED TO AN AUTOMATED 14 PHARMACY DISPENSING SYSTEM FOR REDISPENSING AS LONG AS THE 15 INTEGRITY OF THE MEDICATION HAS NOT BEEN ALTERED, BAR CODE 16 SCANNING TECHNOLOGY IS USED FOR RETURNING THE DRUG, 17 QUALIFICATIONS FOR RETURNING THE DRUG ARE MAINTAINED, AND THE 18 EXPIRATION DATE OF THE DRUG HAS NOT PASSED. A PHARMACY 19 TECHNICIAN MAY CARRY OUT THE PROCESS OF REDISPENSING THE DRUG 20 ISSUED IN ACCORDANCE WITH RULES ESTABLISHED BY THE BOARD.

(c) A PRESCRIPTION DRUG THAT IS DISPENSED BUT NOT DELIVERED
TO A PATIENT MAY BE RETURNED TO STOCK AND REDISPENSED AS LONG AS
IT IS STORED IN THE CONTAINER IN WHICH IT WAS DISPENSED AND
MAINTAINS A LABEL THAT ACCURATELY IDENTIFIES ITS CONTENTS WITH
RESPECT TO THE ORIGINAL PRESCRIPTION LABEL.

SECTION 4. Effective date - applicability. This act takes effect
 July 1, 2024, and applies to prescription drugs dispensed on or after said

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1 date.

2 SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly finds, 3 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 4 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for 5 the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state 6 institutions.
