A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING FUNDING FOR RURAL HEALTH CARE, AND, IN
102 CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. For the Colorado rural health-care workforce initiative (workforce initiative), the bill authorizes the department of higher education to enter into a limited purpose fee-for-service contract with the board of regents of the university of Colorado for allocation to programs or institutions of higher education to expand an existing rural track program. If an allocation is made to a program or institution to expand an existing rural

track program, the department of higher education shall utilize a formula developed and revised annually by the rural program office that is based on data that documents the program's or institution's fulfillment of certain requirements. The bill requires the rural program office to submit a report to the general assembly each year that includes the allocation formula developed by the rural program office.

The bill authorizes any money not expended or encumbered from any appropriation at the end of any fiscal year to remain available for expenditure for the workforce initiative in the next fiscal year without further appropriation.

The bill requires the department of health care policy and financing to distribute money appropriated for payments to rural hospitals.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-76.5-104, **amend**
3 (1) as follows:

4 **23-76.5-104. Initiative reporting.** (1) On or before November
5 1, 2023, and on or before November 1 each year thereafter, the rural
6 program office shall submit a report to the house of representatives
7 education committee and the senate education committee, or their
8 successor committees, concerning the initiative. The report must include:

9 (a) Information about each institution's health-care professionals
10 rural tracks, the number of students enrolled in each rural track, the
11 number of students who have completed each rural track and are
12 practicing in a rural or frontier county, and any other relevant data and
13 information about the initiative; ~~and~~

14 (b) The rural program office's analysis of the effectiveness of the
15 initiative and rural tracks; AND

16 (c) THE ALLOCATION FORMULA DEVELOPED PURSUANT TO SECTION
17 23-76.5-105 (2)(c).

18 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-76.5-105, **amend**

1 (1), (2)(a) introductory portion, and (2)(a)(VI)(A); and **add** (2)(c) and (3)
2 as follows:

3 **23-76.5-105. Initiative funding - fee-for-service contracts.**

4 (1) Subject to available appropriations, the department of higher
5 education shall enter into a limited purpose fee-for-service contract with
6 the university of Colorado health sciences center pursuant to section
7 23-18-308 to provide funding for the rural program office IN THE
8 DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY MEDICINE to carry out ~~its~~ THE OFFICE'S duties
9 described in section 23-76.5-103. The funding for the rural program
10 office may be included in a single fee-for-service contract with the
11 university of Colorado health sciences center ~~described in~~ PURSUANT TO
12 subsection (2) of this section.

13 (2) (a) Subject to available appropriations, the department of
14 higher education shall enter into a limited purpose fee-for-service contract
15 with the governing boards of each of the following institutions, except for
16 Colorado mountain college, for allocation to each program or ~~school~~
17 INSTITUTION listed in this subsection (2) to establish or expand an existing
18 rural track pursuant to this article 76.5:

19 (VI) The university of Colorado, in the following programs or
20 schools:

21 (A) At the health sciences center campus, in its school of dental
22 medicine and in THE RURAL PROGRAM OF its doctor of medicine program
23 in the school of medicine;

24 (c) SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE APPROPRIATIONS, THE DEPARTMENT OF
25 HIGHER EDUCATION MAY ENTER INTO A LIMITED PURPOSE
26 FEE-FOR-SERVICE CONTRACT WITH THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE
27 UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO FOR ALLOCATION TO EACH PROGRAM OR

1 INSTITUTION LISTED IN SUBSECTION (2)(a) OF THIS SECTION TO EXPAND AN
2 EXISTING RURAL TRACK PROGRAM PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE 76.5. THE
3 RURAL PROGRAM OFFICE SHALL DEVELOP A FORMULA BASED ON DATA
4 THAT DOCUMENTS THE PROGRAM'S OR INSTITUTION'S FULFILLMENT OF THE
5 REQUIREMENTS SPECIFIED IN SECTION 23-76.5-102 FOR THE DEPARTMENT
6 OF HIGHER EDUCATION TO USE TO MAKE ALLOCATIONS TO A PROGRAM OR
7 INSTITUTION PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (2)(c). WHEN DEVELOPING
8 THE ALLOCATION FORMULA, THE RURAL PROGRAM OFFICE SHALL
9 CONSIDER:

10 (I) THE PERCENTAGE OF MONEY DEDICATED TO DIRECT STUDENT
11 SUPPORT IN THE FORM OF SCHOLARSHIPS AND RURAL HOUSING ASSISTANCE
12 DURING RURAL PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE;

13 (II) THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS ENROLLED IN EACH RURAL TRACK
14 PROGRAM;

15 (III) THE LENGTH OF STUDY FOR THE RURAL TRACK PROGRAM;

16 (IV) THE TUITION EXPENSES FOR THE RURAL TRACK PROGRAM;

17 (V) THE AMOUNT OF RURAL CURRICULUM PROVIDED TO STUDENTS;

18 (VI) THE RURAL PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE PROVIDED TO STUDENTS;

19 (VII) THE TEACHING DEVELOPMENT PROVIDED TO VOLUNTEER
20 RURAL PRECEPTORS; AND

21 (VIII) THE NUMBER OF GRADUATES WHO ENTER RURAL PRACTICE.

22 (3) ANY MONEY NOT EXPENDED OR ENCUMBERED FROM ANY
23 APPROPRIATION AT THE END OF ANY FISCAL YEAR REMAINS AVAILABLE
24 FOR EXPENDITURE FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS SECTION IN THE NEXT FISCAL
25 YEAR WITHOUT FURTHER APPROPRIATION.

26 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 25.5-4-431 as
27 follows:

1 **25.5-4-431. State payments to rural hospitals - definition.**

2 (1) THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL DISTRIBUTE MONEY APPROPRIATED
3 FOR PAYMENTS TO RURAL HOSPITALS.

4 (2) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, "RURAL HOSPITAL" MEANS A
5 HOSPITAL LICENSED OR CERTIFIED PURSUANT TO SECTION 25-1.5-103
6 (1)(a) OR AN AFFILIATE OWNED OR CONTROLLED, AS DEFINED IN SECTION
7 25.5-4-402.8 (1)(c), BY A HOSPITAL, AND THAT IS LOCATED IN A COUNTY
8 WITH A POPULATION OF FEWER THAN FIFTY THOUSAND RESIDENTS OR IN A
9 MUNICIPALITY WITH A POPULATION OF FEWER THAN TWENTY-FIVE
10 THOUSAND RESIDENTS IF THE MUNICIPALITY IS NOT CONTIGUOUS TO A
11 MUNICIPALITY WITH A POPULATION OF TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND OR MORE
12 RESIDENTS.

13 **SECTION 4. Appropriation.** (1) For the 2024-25 state fiscal
14 year, \$866,667 is appropriated to the department of higher education. This
15 appropriation is from the general fund. To implement this act, the
16 department may use this appropriation for the college opportunity fund
17 program to be used for limited purpose fee-for-service contracts with
18 state institutions.

19 (2) For the 2024-25 state fiscal year, \$866,667 is appropriated to
20 the department of higher education. This appropriation is from
21 reappropriated funds received from the limited purpose fee-for-service
22 contracts with state institutions under subsection (1) of this section. To
23 implement this act, the department may use this appropriation for the
24 regents of the university of Colorado for allocation to institutions of
25 higher education pursuant to section 23-76.5-105 (2)(c), C.R.S.

26 (3) For the 2024-25 state fiscal year, \$1,742,029 is appropriated
27 to the department of health care policy and financing for use by other

1 medical services. This appropriation is from the general fund. To
2 implement this act, the department may use this appropriation for state
3 payments to rural hospitals.

4 **SECTION 5. Safety clause.** The general assembly finds,
5 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
6 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
7 the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
8 institutions.
