A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING FUNDING FOR RURAL HEALTH CARE, AND, IN

102 CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <u>http://leg.colorado.gov.</u>)

For the Colorado rural health-care workforce initiative (workforce initiative), the bill authorizes the department of higher education to enter into a limited purpose fee-for-service contract with the board of regents of the university of Colorado for allocation to programs or institutions of higher education to expand an existing rural track program. If an allocation is made to a program or institution to expand an existing rural

track program, the department of higher education shall utilize a formula developed and revised annually by the rural program office that is based on data that documents the program's or institution's fulfillment of certain requirements. The bill requires the rural program office to submit a report to the general assembly each year that includes the allocation formula developed by the rural program office.

The bill authorizes any money not expended or encumbered from any appropriation at the end of any fiscal year to remain available for expenditure for the workforce initiative in the next fiscal year without further appropriation.

The bill requires the department of health care policy and financing to distribute money appropriated for payments to rural hospitals.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

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SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-76.5-104, amend

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23-76.5-104. Initiative reporting. (1) On or before November 1, 2023, and on or before November 1 each year thereafter, the rural program office shall submit a report to the house of representatives

- 18 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-76.5-105, amend

(1), (2)(a) introductory portion, and (2)(a)(VI)(A); and add (2)(c) and (3)
 as follows:

3 23-76.5-105. Initiative funding - fee-for-service contracts. 4 Subject to available appropriations, the department of higher (1)5 education shall enter into a limited purpose fee-for-service contract with 6 the university of Colorado health sciences center pursuant to section 7 23-18-308 to provide funding for the rural program office IN THE 8 DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY MEDICINE to carry out its THE OFFICE'S duties 9 described in section 23-76.5-103. The funding for the rural program 10 office may be included in a single fee-for-service contract with the 11 university of Colorado health sciences center described in PURSUANT TO 12 subsection (2) of this section.

(2) (a) Subject to available appropriations, the department of
higher education shall enter into a limited purpose fee-for-service contract
with the governing boards of each of the following institutions, except for
Colorado mountain college, for allocation to each program or school
INSTITUTION listed in this subsection (2) to establish or expand an existing
rural track pursuant to this article 76.5:

(VI) The university of Colorado, in the following programs orschools:

(A) At the health sciences center campus, in its school of dental
medicine and in THE RURAL PROGRAM OF its doctor of medicine program
in the school of medicine;

1 INSTITUTION LISTED IN SUBSECTION (2)(a) OF THIS SECTION TO EXPAND AN 2 EXISTING RURAL TRACK PROGRAM PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE 76.5. THE 3 RURAL PROGRAM OFFICE, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE INSTITUTIONS, 4 SHALL DEVELOP A FORMULA BASED ON DATA THAT DOCUMENTS THE 5 PROGRAM'S OR INSTITUTION'S FULFILLMENT OF THE REQUIREMENTS 6 SPECIFIED IN SECTION 23-76.5-102 FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF HIGHER 7 EDUCATION TO USE TO MAKE ALLOCATIONS TO A PROGRAM OR 8 INSTITUTION PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (2)(c). 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2 25.5-4-431. State payments to rural hospitals - definition.
(1) THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL DISTRIBUTE MONEY APPROPRIATED
FOR PAYMENTS TO RURAL HOSPITALS.

5 (2) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, "RURAL HOSPITAL" MEANS A 6 HOSPITAL LICENSED OR CERTIFIED PURSUANT TO SECTION 25-1.5-103 7 (1)(a) OR AN AFFILIATE OWNED OR CONTROLLED, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 8 25.5-4-402.8 (1)(c), BY A HOSPITAL, AND THAT IS LOCATED IN A COUNTY 9 WITH A POPULATION OF FEWER THAN FIFTY THOUSAND RESIDENTS OR IN A 10 MUNICIPALITY WITH A POPULATION OF FEWER THAN TWENTY-FIVE 11 THOUSAND RESIDENTS IF THE MUNICIPALITY IS NOT CONTIGUOUS TO A 12 MUNICIPALITY WITH A POPULATION OF TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND OR MORE 13 RESIDENTS.

SECTION 4. Appropriation. (1) For the 2024-25 state fiscal year, \$866,667 is appropriated to the department of higher education. This appropriation is from the general fund. To implement this act, the department may use this appropriation for the college opportunity fund program to be used for limited purpose fee-for-service contracts with state institutions.

(2) For the 2024-25 state fiscal year, \$866,667 is appropriated to
the department of higher education. This appropriation is from
reappropriated funds received from the limited purpose fee-for-service
contracts with state institutions under subsection (1) of this section. To
implement this act, the department may use this appropriation for the
regents of the university of Colorado for allocation to institutions of
higher education pursuant to section 23-76.5-105 (2)(c), C.R.S.

(3) For the 2024-25 state fiscal year, \$1,742,029 is appropriated

to the department of health care policy and financing for use by other
medical services. This appropriation is from the general fund. To
implement this act, the department may use this appropriation for state
payments to rural hospitals.

5 SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly finds, 6 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 7 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for 8 the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state 9 institutions.
