	CONCERNING THE FIFTY-SIXTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CAPTURE OF THE	
	U.S.S. PUEBLO BY NORTH KOREA.	
	WHEREAS, The U.S.S. Pueblo was originally launched as a	
	United States Army cargo ship in 1944 but was transferred to the United	
	States Navy and renamed the U.S.S. Pueblo in 1966; and	
	WHEREAS, The U.S.S. Pueblo was named for the city of Pueblo,	
	Colorado, and the county of Pueblo, Colorado, and was the third ship in	
	the naval fleet to bear the name Pueblo; and	
	WHEREAS, After leaving Japan in early January 1968 on an	
	intelligence mission, the U.S.S. Pueblo was attacked by the North Korean	
	military on January 23, 1968; and	

1	WHEREAS, According to United States naval authorities and the
2	crew of the U.S.S. Pueblo, the ship was in international waters at the time
3	of the attack; and
4	WHEREAS, Navy Fireman Duane Hodges of the U.S.S. Pueblo
5	was killed during the attack, and eighty crew members and two civilian
6	oceanographers were captured and held for eleven months by the North
7	Korean government; and
8	WHEREAS, This year marks the fifty-sixth anniversary of North
9	Korea's attack on the U.S.S. Pueblo and her crew; and
10	WHEREAS, The U.S.S. Pueblo is still in commission in the
11	United States Navy but continues to be held by the North Korean
12	government and is currently in a museum in Pyongyang, North Korea;
13	now, therefore,
14	Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the
15	Seventy-fourth General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate
16	concurring herein:
17	(1) That we, the members of the General Assembly, recognize the
18	bravery and sacrifice of the crew of the U.S.S. Pueblo;
19	(2) That we take pride in the fact that the U.S.S. Pueblo bears the
20	name of a city and a county in Colorado, and, therefore, the citizens of
21	Colorado should be aware of the incident that occurred with the U.S.S.
22	Pueblo fifty-six years ago;
23	(3) That we continue the call for Kim Jong Un and the North
24	Korean government to return the U.S.S. Pueblo to the people of the
25	United States; and
26	(4) That we designate January 23 of each year as "U.S.S. Pueblo
27	Day", a day to remember and honor the brave crew of the U.S.S. Pueblo.
28	Be It Further Resolved, That copies of this Joint Resolution be sent
29	to President Joseph R. Biden, Jr.; Governor Jared Polis; and the members
30	of Colorado's Congressional delegation.
