HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 24-1014

101 CONCERNING RECOGNITION AND REMEMBRANCE OF COLORADO

102 MILITARY VETERANS WHO SERVED IN THE PERSIAN GULF WAR.

WHEREAS, American involvement in the Gulf War began in
 1990 with Operation Desert Shield, which marked the deployment of U.S.
 service members to Saudi Arabia in response to the Iraqi invasion of
 Kuwait; and

5 WHEREAS, The deployment of U.S. service members to the 6 Persian Gulf marked the beginning of a six-month-long war with Iraq that 7 would eventually end following a successful aerial bombing campaign 8 and ground invasion referred to as Operation Desert Storm; and

9 WHEREAS, The United States led a forty-two-country 10 international coalition-the largest since World War II-with the purpose of 1 liberating Iraqi-occupied Kuwait; and

WHEREAS, One hundred forty-three members of the United
States Armed Forces, including three Coloradans, were killed in action
over the course of the Persian Gulf War; and

- 5 WHEREAS, It is, and will forever remain, society's solemn 6 obligation to recognize the service rendered by Gulf War veterans and the 7 sacrifice associated with that service; now, therefore,
- 8 Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the 9 Seventy-fourth General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate 10 concurring herein:
- 12 That we, the members of the Colorado General Assembly, hereby:
- 13 (1) Acknowledge and recognize the veterans of the Gulf War for14 the service they rendered;
- 15 (2) Honor those who made the ultimate sacrifice and gave their16 lives in service to their country;
- 17 (3) Express our heartfelt gratitude and sympathy to the families of18 fallen service members; and
- 19 (4) Encourage all Coloradans to remember the sacrifices made by20 Gulf War veterans and their families.
- Be It Further Resolved, That copies of this Joint Resolution be sent
 to the Colorado Department of Military and Veterans Affairs; the United
 Veterans Coalition of Colorado; the President of the United States Joseph
 R. Biden, Jr.; the honorable Jared Polis, Governor of Colorado; and the
 Colorado Congressional delegation.
