HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 24-1014 101 CONCERNING RECOGNITION AND REMEMBRANCE OF COLORADO 102 MILITARY VETERANS WHO SERVED IN THE PERSIAN GULF WAR. 1 WHEREAS, American involvement in the Gulf War began in 2 1990 with Operation Desert Shield, which marked the deployment of U.S. 3 service members to Saudi Arabia in response to the Iraqi invasion of 4 Kuwait; and 5 WHEREAS, The deployment of U.S. service members to the 6 Persian Gulf marked the beginning of a six-month-long war with Iraq that 7 would eventually end following a successful aerial bombing campaign 8 and ground invasion referred to as Operation Desert Storm; and 9 WHEREAS, The United States led a forty-two-country 10 international coalition-the largest since World War II-with the purpose of
