### **Resolution Summary**

The Colorado constitution states that a marriage is valid only if it is between one man and one woman. That provision has been unenforceable since the United States supreme court decision in *Obergefell v. Hodges*, 576 U.S. 644 (2015). The concurrent resolution repeals the provision.

1	Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-fourth General
2	Assembly of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives
3	concurring herein:
4	SECTION 1. At the election held on November 5, 2024, the
5	secretary of state shall submit to the registered electors of the state the
6	ballot title set forth in section 2 for the following amendment to the state
7	constitution:
8	In the constitution of the state of Colorado, repeal section 31 of
9	article II as follows:
10	Section 31. Marriages - valid or recognized. Only a union of
11	one man and one woman shall be valid or recognized as a marriage in this
12	state.
13	SECTION 2. Each elector voting at the election may cast a vote
14	either "Yes/For" or "No/Against" on the following ballot title: "Shall
15	there be an amendment to the Colorado constitution removing the ban on
16	same-sex marriage?"
17	<b>SECTION 3.</b> Except as otherwise provided in section 1-40-123,
18	Colorado Revised Statutes, if a majority of the electors voting on the
19	ballot title vote "Yes/For", then the amendment will become part of the
20	state constitution.
