	The bill would have created a mechanism for legislators to publicly share drafts of legislation prior to the official introduction of the bills. It would have increased state expenditures in FY 2024-25 only.				
Appropriation Summary:	For FY 2024-25, the bill would have required an appropriation of \$61,440 to the Legislative Department.				
Fiscal Note Status:	The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill. The bill was deemed lost on Senate Second Reading on May 9, 2024; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

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Summary of Legislation

The bill requires the General Assembly to create a mechanism through which legislators may publicly share the titles and contents of draft bills they are considering during the interim between legislative sessions. The bill titles and draft must be published on a website that is accessible by the public and be searchable by category, prime sponsor name, and draft bill assigned by the Office of Legislative Legal Services. All titles and bill drafts are required to be removed from the website on the day prior to the start of the next legislative session.

Legislators may share up to three different versions of each title, bill, or combination thereof, but only one version per bill may be published on any given day. Changes to the website that publishes potential titles and bill drafts can only be made on three days per year: 90, 60, and 30 days prior to the start of the next legislative session.

Each bill title or draft on the website must include the following disclaimer: "This is a draft of a bill that may or may not be introduced in the House of Representatives or the Senate of the Colorado General Assembly during the upcoming regular legislative session. The final decision-making authority regarding introduction of the bill rests exclusively with its legislative prime sponsor in the chamber in which the bill will first be introduced if it is introduced. This draft is not final and is subject to change both before and after introduction in the first chamber."

State Expenditures

The bill increases state expenditures in the Legislative Department for FY 2024-25 by \$61,440.

Legislative Council Staff. The bill requires the General Assembly to make potential bill titles and drafts publicly available on a website. In order to create and develop the website, Legislative Council Staff will require approximately 480 hours of computer programming at \$128 per hour, for a total cost of \$61,440.

Legislative Legal Services. The bill will increase workload in the Office of Legislative Legal Services related to posting bill titles and drafts during the interim between legislative sessions. The increase can be absorbed within current appropriations.

Other Budget Impacts

General Fund reserve. Under current law, an amount equal to 15 percent of General Fund appropriations must be set aside in the General Fund statutory reserve. Based on this fiscal note, the bill is expected to increase the amount of General Fund held in reserve by the amounts shown in Table 1, decreasing the amount of General Fund available for other purposes.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.

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State Appropriations

For FY 2024-25, the bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$61,440 to the Legislative Department.
