Fiscal Note Status:	The final fiscal note reflects the introduced bill as amended by the House Health and Human Services Committee. The bill was deemed lost in the House Appropriations Committee on May 9, 2024; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

### **Summary of Legislation**

The bill requires the Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA) to conduct an actuarial review of fertility coverage for individual and small group health benefit plans.

#### **State Diversions**

This bill diverts \$42,000 from the General Fund in FY 2024-25. This revenue diversion occurs because the bill increases costs in the Division of Insurance, which is funded with premium tax revenue that would otherwise be credited to the General Fund.

### **State Expenditures**

The bill increases costs in DORA by \$42,000 in FY 2024-25 only, paid from the Division of Insurance Cash Fund. Expenditures are shown in Table 2 and detailed below

**Department of Regulatory Agencies.** DORA will have costs to produce the actuarial report, including contractor costs and data related fees totaling \$42,000, as discussed below. Estimates are based on the costs for <u>Senate Bill 22-040</u>, for which DORA received appropriations to conduct six actuarial reviews annually. It is assumed that existing SB 22-040 funding will be used for analyses requested through that process and that additional funding is required for the new analysis required by this bill.

- **Contractor costs.** Actuarial contractor costs are estimated at 40 hours per bill at the rate of \$400 per hour to provide rate and utilization estimates. In addition, consultant costs are estimated at 30 hours per bill at the rate of \$300 per hour to provide qualitative analysis.
- **Data-related fees.** Data from the Center of Improving Value in Health Care is estimated to cost approximately \$10,000 per bill. The fiscal note also includes \$7,000 per bill since the qualitative analysis is likely to require additional charges or fees.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.

## **State Appropriation**

For FY 2024-25, the bill would have required an appropriation of \$42,000 from the Division of Insurance Cash Fund to the Department of Regulatory Agencies
