Fiscal Note Status:	The final fiscal note reflects the introduced bill. The bill was postponed indefinitely by the Senate Health and Human Services Committee on April 18, 2024; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.		

### **Summary of Legislation**

The bill permits the governing board of a municipality to authorize overdose prevention centers within their boundaries. Overdose prevention centers provide space for individuals to use controlled substances under the supervision of healthcare professionals or other trained staff that can provide life-saving treatment during an overdose, and other harm reduction services.

### **Local Government**

Conditional upon municipal approval, the bill may increase municipal workload associated with any regulatory role over an overdose prevention center.

### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
