Summary of Legislation

Under current law, the Colorado Department of Agriculture has the authority to assist the U.S. Bureau of Land Management in managing wild horse populations using fertility control management methods and supporting on-range stewardship to ensure the sustainability of wild horses. Current law repeals this authority on July 31, 2024.

This bill extends the repeal date to December 31, 2025.

State Expenditures

The bill extends spending of existing funding by the Colorado Department of Agriculture on wild horse management through FY 2025-26. The department received an appropriation of \$400,000 in FY 2023-24 to the Wild Horse Project Fund, which is continuously appropriated to the department. This funding will continue to support the Wild Horse Project Fund through the new repeal date of December 31, 2025.

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Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.

State Appropriations

No appropriation is required. The Wild Horse Project Fund is continuously appropriated to the Department of Agriculture.
