	The bill allows convicted felons to change their name to conform with their gender identity. The bill may minimally increase state and local revenue and expenditures on an ongoing basis.

### **Summary of Legislation**

Under current law, a person convicted of a felony who wishes to change their name must demonstrate they have "good cause" to change their name. The bill expands the definition of "good cause" to include a name change that conforms with the person's gender identify.

#### State and Local Revenue and Expenditures

To the extent the bill increases the number of petitions for name changes, the bill may increase revenue and workload in the trial courts of the Judicial Department and Denver County Court, as well as to the Colorado Bureau of Investigation for the associated background check.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
