**Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.001** Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$64,738 General Fund to the Behavioral Health Administration for FY 2024-25. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Administration will require

an additional 0.5 FTE.

**Points to Consider**

*General Fund Impact*

The Joint Budget Committee (JBC) is developing a budget package for FY 2024-25. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$64,738 for FY 2024-25, reducing the General Fund available for other FY 2024-25 appropriations by this amount.
